Emotional and Behavioral Issues:



Higher rates of anxiety, depression, and anger due to the absence of paternal support and guidance. 2

Academic Challenges:



Lower academic performance and higher dropout rates as a result of decreased parental involvement and support.

Increased likelihood of living in poverty, engaging in criminal activity, and struggling with relationships later in life.
