

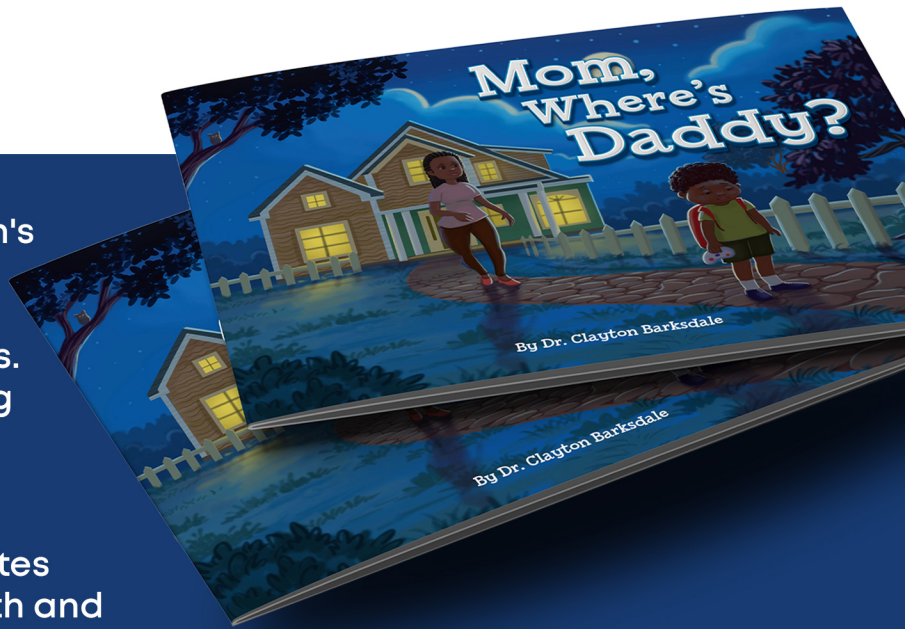
Second Chance
