

A message from Pastor Meeker

"If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died." (1 Corinthians 15:19-20)

How delightful our Easter Sunday was and continues through the wonderful Easter season. Easter Sunday is our central worship gathering and the proclamation that marks every Sunday as a "little Easter Sunday." We are an Easter People.

We might remember author Gerhard Frost. He shared about gathering for Easter worship in a Midwest church. He took his place in a pew and happened to recognize a childhood friend sitting in front of him. The service began with the pastor announcing the Easter Acclamation "Christ is Risen!" The congregation responded with an enthusiastic "He is Risen, indeed!" Later in the service came the time for exchanging the peace greeting. Frost eagerly touched his old friend's arm and, as she turned, exclaimed to her, "He is Risen!" To his surprise there were tears running down her cheeks as she responded, "He is Risen, indeed!" and then added in a whisper, "And it had better be true!" After the service she then informed him of her husband's recent death.

There is certainly a lot to be said for the beauty and joyful gathering of people at Easter. A time to gather as families who come together and who enjoy their reunions, the hints of Spring and special efforts we put into this festive and central worship in the Church. Like Christmas, we have memories of Easters long ago. We are mindful with the passing of time, and the shadow of death over many in all our family circles. Many have come to see Easter as the greatest necessity for our everyday lives and living. If hope is to flourish, "It had better be true!"

Theologian Karl Barth, was once asked, "What is the profoundest truth you have ever encountered?" he unwaveringly replied, "Jesus loves me, this I know for the Bible tells me so." Thanks to all for signing and singing the amazing song Jesus Loves Me during many of our children's messages.

One can go deeper than this. All wisdom connects with this affirmation. God is love, and this love has culminated in the greatest event of all time, the resurrection of Jesus as the above scripture reminds us and we believe or are trying to believe. No other answer to death has ever been found. This event is stronger than anything that can be said or done to defeat it. Christ's Easter victory is the only thing that is greater than the cries of people.

As believers and followers of Jesus we are called to live in this "Yes" to life in Christ. We filter everything we know about God through this central event of the resurrection. This is our hope, beyond all lesser hopes and dreams. The Apostle Paul reminds us, if we have hope only for this life, we are most to be pitied. Our human experience teaches us that such hope is not enough. All of us come to the moment when human consolation cannot lift our burdens.

Our prayers for our faith community and the Church world-wide as we live post-Easter is; "Make us every day Easter People Lord! By the promise of your Pentecost Spirit, lead us into being instruments of your transforming power, presence, promise and peace. Help us to be bearers of God's 'Yes' in Jesus through all our living, especially serving others. In him is life. Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed! Amen!" We thank God for everyone who helps in the mission and ministry of this congregation through their faith witness of words and actions. Thank you for your faithfulness.

who live in poverty or whose lives have been disrupted by war or conflict.


All Church Camp Cook needed


