SUMMER VACATION

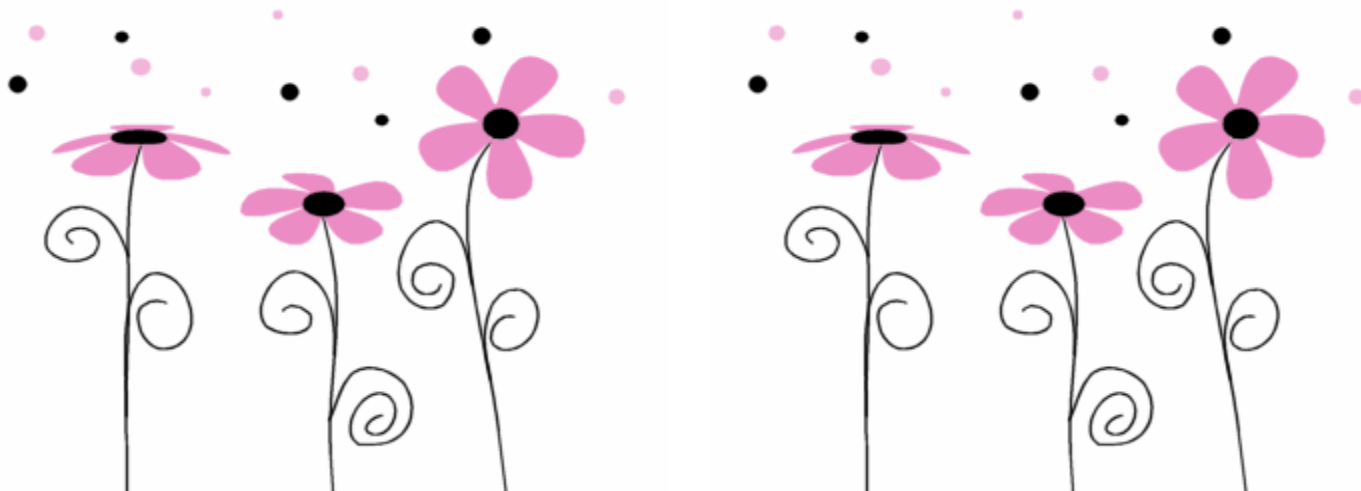
No classes will be held this year during July and August. Our school year ended in June and now our staff is enjoying a well-deserved break!

Message on 2022 Budget

Dear fellow members of OSLC:

I am proud to be a member of OSLC, which has been in existence for over 125 years, and our congregation members have always stepped up to meet all challenges.

These last two and one-half years have been tough for our Nation, State, and our Church due to Covid and the lockdowns. Throughout it all, OSLC has continued to provide worship services, both in person and on-line streaming, as well as opening our facility to outside groups.

In 2021, we experienced a fiscal shortfall, which the congregation overcame. For the first two months of 2022, we continued to show positive numbers. However, the last three months offerings have not kept pace with expenses.

It has always been Pastor's and Council's policy to be open and transparent with the congregation. That said, please review the chart below. As of the end of May 2022, our expenses exceeded our income leaving a deficit of (\$16,165.00)

If this trend continues, we could show a deficit by year-end of (\$36,000.00). Pastor and Council have discussed this current shortfall and developed some possible solutions for the congregation's consideration.

Short term solutions:

Additional offerings: If members have been waiting to makeup offerings or give additional offerings, now would be the time.

Using OSLC saving reserves for operating: Current trend, if we use them, we would be out of reserves within the next year to year-and-a-half. **Once the reserves are gone, they are gone.**

Go from full-time Pastor to Part-time Pastor, with possible other staff reductions: Although it may not be the case for all businesses, salaries and benefits by far are our largest expense.

Is it time to re-evaluate Benevolences: We have always taken pride in that benevolences are paid first out of offerings. However, it might be time to use these funds toward OSLC?

Find new occupants to rent our unused church space, provided it falls within current IRS rules.

Long term solutions:

Increase membership: therefore, increase offerings.

Combining congregations and sharing resources.

Include OSLC in your Estate planning.

As always, Pastor and Council would encourage you sharing your thoughts and input regarding this current fiscal situation.

Donations will go toward helping refugee families with case management, food, rent, child care, transportation and many other vital services provided by LCSNW.

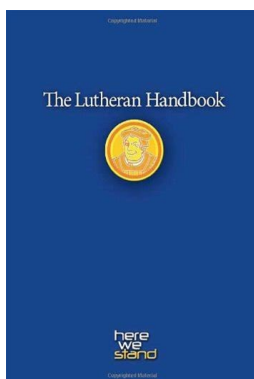


