

Fourth Sunday after Trinity

This Sunday centers on God's mercy to all who suffer. The Historic Epistle Reading (Romans 8:18-23) speaks of the host encamped against us, the misery in man and in the world, the sufferings of this present time, the futility to which creation is subjected and under which it is groaning, and the inward groaning even of those who have the fruits of the Spirit through faith.

But these afflictions are transient, part of God's purpose of mercy working all things for good. All this is not only consistent with, but also an instance of and part of God's plan. He is mercifully preparing us for the adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies; the inheritance of heaven.

In like manner the Historic Gospel calls on us to imitate our Father in showing mercy to others. In this regard there is especially the matter of avoiding loveless judgment. Our Father's loving mercy to us is to be the motive and measure of our mercy in our relationships with others.

ISAIAH 58:6-12. "Is this not the fast which I choose, To loosen the bonds of wickedness, To undo the bands of the yoke, And to let the oppressed go free And break every yoke? ⁷ "Is it not to divide your bread with the hungry And bring the homeless poor into the house; When you see the naked, to cover him; And not to hide yourself from your own flesh? ⁸ "Then your light will break out like the dawn, And your recovery will speedily spring forth; And your righteousness will go before you; The glory of the Lord will be your rear guard. ⁹ "Then you will call, and the Lord will answer; You will cry, and He will say, 'Here I am.' If you remove the yoke from your midst, The pointing of the finger and speaking wickedness, ¹⁰ And if you give yourself to the hungry And satisfy the desire of the afflicted, Then your light will rise in darkness And your gloom will become like midday. ¹¹ "And

C: It was only that they might be destroyed forevermore. But You, O Lord, are on high forever.

EPISTLE

ROMANS 14:7-17. For not one of us lives for himself, and not one dies for himself; ⁸ for if we live, we live for the Lord, or if we die, we die for the Lord; therefore whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. ⁹ For to this end Christ died and lived again, that He might be Lord both of the dead and of the living. ¹⁰ But you, why do you judge your brother? Or you again, why do you regard your brother with contempt? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. ¹¹ For it is written,

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to Me, And every tongue shall give praise to God."

¹² So then each one of us will give an account of himself to God. ¹³ Therefore let us not judge one another anymore, but rather determine this—not to put

an obstacle or a stumbling block in a brother's way. ¹⁴ I know and am convinced in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself; but to him who thinks anything to be unclean, to him it is unclean. ¹⁵ For if because of food your brother is hurt, you are no longer walking according to love. Do not destroy with your food him for whom Christ died. ¹⁶ Therefore do not let what is for you a good thing be spoken of as evil; ¹⁷ for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

P: This too is the Word of the LORD.

C: (Spoken) Thanks be to God.

GRADUAL

P: Forgive our sins, O LORD, so that the unbelievers cannot say, "What good does their God do them?"

C: Help us, O God of our salvation; and for the glory of Your name deliver us. Hallelujah! Hallelujah!

P: O God, Who sits on the throne, judging perfectly, be a Refuge for Your children in times of trouble. Hallelujah!

C: (Sing) Hallelujah! Hallelujah!

HOLY GOSPEL

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, Fifth Chapter, vs 38-48. C: (Sing) Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

MATTHEW 5:38-48. ³⁸ "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.' ³⁹ But I say to you, do not resist an evil person; but whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. ⁴⁰ If anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, let him have your coat also. ⁴¹ Whoever forces you to go one mile, go with him two. ⁴² Give to him who asks of you, and do not turn away from him who wants to borrow from you. ⁴³ "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who

persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ If you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? ⁴⁸ Therefore you are to be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect. (*Bible readings are courtesy of Bible Gateway*, *NASB 95*)

SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT

Visitors please read this! Trinity practices the Biblical teaching of "Closed Communion," meaning that only members of our congregation or those in doctrinal fellowship with us have the privilege of joining us in the celebration of our Lord's Supper. If you desire to commune with us today, please obtain a questionnaire from the Pastor or an Elder and follow the instructions printed there. Thank you! Communion Distribution Notes. After the Pastor announces, "The congregation may now come forward for the Lord's Supper": Communicants on BOTH sides of pews will come to the center aisle at the same time and line up next to their respective pews; Come forward 4 or 5 at the same time, each to the side of the communion rail in front of them; Communicants may receive the Host (wafer) in their hand or mouth as they desire and receive either individual or common cup (Chalice). When the rail in front of each side is empty another group will come forward.

THE WORDS OF OUR LORD

P: *Our Lord Jesus Christ*, on the night He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me."

Then He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is My blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

LUTHER'S EXHORTATIONS TO HOLY COMMUNION

P: Not the word or work of any man produces the true presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Supper, whether it be the merit or recitation of the minister,

C: Or the eating and drinking or faith of the communicants;

P: But all this should be ascribed alone to the power of Almighty God and the word, institution, and ordination of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Formula of Concord, Article VII, paragraph 74)
