The Sixteenth Sunday after Trinity

The cares and worries of this life, the lack of complete trust in the Father's love, will gradually grow into a deliberate and endless giving in to our flesh and completely wreck our faith in God!

The only sure and certain cure for all anxiety and the encouragement to rise above this fear is in the blessed assurance that the Father cares for us. Thus, we can serve Him with that same kind of trust – however imperfect.

This Sunday's teaching is that we are to seek God's comfort and consolation in our troubles, in persecution, and in all our inner battles. Surely, the agonies of the human heart caused by sorrow, separation, loss, may cause doubts and loss of faith. In short, the lesson of this Sunday is simply: Patience in Tribulation!

FIRST KINGS 17:17-24. ¹⁷ Now it came about after these things that the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, became sick; and his sickness was so severe that there was no breath left in him. ¹⁸ So she said to Elijah, "What do I have to do with you, O man of God? You have come to me to bring my iniquity to remembrance and to put my son to death!" ¹⁹ He said to her, "Give me your son." Then he took him from her bosom and carried him up to

NICENE CREED

The Historic Lectionary as we know it today originated with St. Jerome, who, at the request of Pope Damasus (died in AD 384) prepared the first common Christian Lectionary, which he called the "Liber Comitis" or Companion Book. Thus, the Historic Lectionary of Scripture Readings for Sunday worship is at least one-thousand- six-hundred years old! It is this schedule of Bible readings we will be using during this 2023-2024 Church Year. In addition, the Gospel selections will form the basis for each Sunday sermon.

(A version of an English translation of the original German prayer used by American Lutheran churches of the General Council in 1868. It was also the basis for the General Prayer of the "Page 5" service of TLH, 1941.)

Omnipotent God, Who is worthy to be held in awe by all people, we give You most humble and hearty thanks for the many blessings, which, without any merit or worthiness on our part, You have bestowed upon us. We praise You especially that You have preserved Your saving Word and the Holy Sacraments in truth and purity. Continue to protect and extend Your kingdom throughout the world. Give Your Church faithful Pastors, and grant success to their preaching. Open the door of faith unto unbelievers everywhere, including all the children of Abraham. In mercy remember the enemies of Your Church, and grant unto them repentance unto eternal life. Be the Protector and Defender of Your people in all times of tribulation and danger. Cause all those in Your Church to fight the good fight of faith, and in the end receive the salvation of our souls. Bestow Your grace upon all the nations of the earth. Bless our land and all its inhabitants, and all who are in authority. Cause Your Word to be proclaimed openly throughout our country, so that truth and righteousness would grow among us. Defend us from all calamities by fire, water, plague, war, and famine. Prosper everyone in their calling and cause all useful arts to flourish. Be the Protector of the widow and orphan, the Helper of the sick and the needy, and the Comforter of the distressed. As we are but pilgrims on this earth, help us by true faith and godly life to prepare for the world to come; doing the work You have given us; before the End comes when we can work no longer. And when our last hour comes, receive us into Your everlasting kingdom; only through the merits of Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord. Amen.

SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT

VISITORS PLEASE READ THIS! Trinity practices the Biblical teaching of "Closed Communion," meaning that only members of our congregation or those in doctrinal fellowship with us have the privilege of joining us in the celebration of our Lord's Supper. If you desire to commune with us today, please obtain a questionnaire from the Pastor or an Elder and follow the instructions printed there. Thank you! COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION NOTES. After the Pastor announces, "The congregation may now come forward for the Lord's Supper": Communicants on BOTH sides of pews will come to the center aisle at the same time and line up right next to their respective pews; Come forward 4 or 5 at a time, again at the same time, each to the side of the communion rail directly in front of them; Communicants may receive the Host (wafer) in their hand or mouth as they desire and receive either individual or common cup (Chalice). When the rail in front of each side is empty another group will come forward.

Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven: give us this day our daily bread: and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us: and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. C: (Sing) For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Therefore, whoever would be a disciple of Christ, with whom He here speaks, must also consider and observe this,

C: Not from compulsion, as being forced by men,

P: But in obedience to the Lord Jesus Christ, and to please Him.

DISTRIBUTION NUNC DIMITTIS

C: (*Sing*) Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace according to Thy word, for mine eyes have seen Thy salvation, which thou has prepared before the face of all people: a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of Thy people Israel. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

P: O give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good, C: (Sing) And His mercy endureth forever
