

## **JESUS IS KING OF THE JEWS**

Did You Know That If Jesus Is Your Savior Then You Are Jewish?

You may never have even realized it but it is true, you are Jewish. If you accept Jesus as the Holy Messiah of Israel and you worship him in truth, then you are Jewish. This is according to the scriptures themselves. But surprisingly, you are not only "Jewish" you are also a member of Israel. Let's look deeper.

When Paul and John and all the apostles first believed that Jesus was the Messiah, the Holy one of God, they DID NOT cease being Jews and therefore did not cease being members of the nation of Israel either.

Rather, those who rejected Jesus were cut off of it, so says the Bible.

The Apostles and all who followed the Messiah became members of the fulfilled nation of Israel as Jesus became their King and Jesus is, of course, this fulfillment, and He is of course the king of Israel only.

It cannot be said that He is the king of any other nation. So, if Jesus is your king then you are also members of His kingdom, which is to say Israel.

Therefore, of a truth, those who call themselves Jewish but do not worship the Jewish messiah do tell themselves a lie. For how can you be a member of a nation when you do not follow the King of that nation? And how can you be called by any other name but the name of Israel if in fact you sincerely worship and serve the king of Israel, the Jewish messiah?

Does this surprise you? Well think of it this way, are you not a member of the same kingdom as your king? Yes, of course you are, and Jesus is Jewish. Jesus is king of Israel and he is king of no other nation than that. And He is therefore the only way to be a part of this kingdom.

The apostles were of Israel according to their flesh, at first, but gave up their faith in fleshly things and accepted their king by the spirit. Thus understanding that the flesh no longer profited them anything and chose to seek justification by way of truth and spirit through faith in Jesus.

In so doing they remained in Israel, as natural branches of the Jewish tree, and we also were grafted in among them through our faith as well. Essentially we were grafted into the tree of life. Because in Jesus alone do we live.

So what then of those who were of Israel according to the flesh before the coming of Jesus? Did they not remain under the law being separated from the fulfillment of the law? And being separated from the fulfillment of it were they not broken off of it through unbelief? As branches broken off of its tree? The Bible says so.

"For if the firstfruit be holy, the lump is also holy: and if the root be holy, so are the branches. And if some of the branches be broken off, and thou, being a wild olive tree, wert grafted in among them, and with them partakest of the root and fatness of the olive tree; Boast not against the branches. But if thou boast, thou bearest not the root, but the root thee. Thou wilt say then, The branches were broken off, that I might be grafted in. Well; because of unbelief they were broken off, and thou standest by faith. Be not high minded, but fear: For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee. Behold therefore the goodness and severity of God: on them which fell, severity; but toward thee, goodness, if thou continue in his goodness: otherwise thou also shalt be cut off. ' (ROMANS 11:16-:22)

So, if broken off they were no longer part of it because of unbelief, and the Bible also says that flesh profits us nothing.

"It is the spirit that quickeneth (gives life); **the flesh profiteth nothing**: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." (John6:63)

So if broken off and having the flesh profit us nothing then those who were once part of Israel according to the lineage of their flesh are now, according to the word of God, as dead branches (dead in their sins) no longer receiving nutrients from the root of the tree being cut off from it according to the Spirit.

So now, we who were once considered to be gentile according to our flesh are now considered to be Israel according to the spirit of faith in Jesus. We are Jewish. And those who were once part of the tree of Israel as natural branches are now the ones who are considered to be gentiles according to the spirit in which they follow, which to say the spirit of unbelief.

And if we are part of the tree are we not also part of the name of that tree? And if they are broken off of that tree are they not also broken off of the name of that tree? For how can the branches of a tree bearing a different kind of fruit than the name of the tree in which it is called (Israel) actually be that tree? If in fact it is bearing a different fruit? Because in reality, the fruit of the tree of Israel is life and Jesus is the root and seed of that tree.

Therefore we who are members of this tree, bearing the fruits of this tree do also then bear the name of this tree. Being joined with it according to our faith. And if any be broken off of this tree and are no longer partakers of the fruits of this tree because of unbelief how then can they still be called by its name?

Simply put, how can you be called a Christian if you do not worship Jesus? Or how then can you be called a Jew if you in fact do not worship the Messiah? For they are one in the same thing. The word Christian simply means to follow the anointed one (of Israel).

Membership of the tree which is called Israel no longer abides by the flesh but rather by the spirit? Through faith in Jesus. So says the word of God.

"Therefore henceforth know we no man after the flesh: yea, though we have known Christ after the flesh, yet now henceforth know we *him* no more (by the flesh). Therefore if any man *be* in Christ *he is* a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." (ROMANS 11:16)

So we know not Jesus by His flesh, but we now know Him by the spirit, right? We walk with him spiritually, not according to fleshly things.

Is it now more clear that those who are part of the tree are nourished by the tree (spiritually) and bear spiritual fruit according to the tree of which it is a member? And if not a member of this tree it is made known that it is not a member according to the fruit in which it bears.

"Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (MATTHEW 7:16)

Therefore all who worship Jesus are grafted into the tree of Israel with Paul and John and we are therefore Jews along with them according to our faith. For it is TRULY the tree of the Jews that we are grafted into and if we are Jews by faith then we are also members of Israel. For it was not Paul or John or any of the apostles who were broken off of Judaism, but those who did not believe in the truth of Judaism, which is to say, those who did not believe in Jesus, the King of Judaism itself.

It is important to note that Jesus is king of the Jews, King of Israel ONLY. If therefore he is not your king you are simply not part of his kingdom and if he is your king then YOU **are** his kingdom (Israel).

In short, we who believe and worship Jesus are Jewish. We who believe and worship Jesus are members of Israel.

Any who disagree with this are actually saying that Paul and John became something different than a Jew when they accepted Jesus as their savior. You are saying that they were detached from being members of the Jewish tree and were grafted into a different tree, a "Christian" tree. This cannot be.

The Bible says that it was the unbeliever that was broken off.

So they remained in the tree of Israel and we later joined them, were grafted into their JEWISH tree by way of faith.

A great many people would refer to this truth as something called "replacement theology" which is incorrect. We who worship Jesus do not REPLACE Israel, we who worship Jesus ARE Israel.

As the scripture says, "For they are not all Israel who are of Israel. Neither because they are the seed of Abraham are they children but in Isaac shall thy seed be called. That is, they which are the children of the flesh, these are not the children of God, but the children of the promise are counted for the seed." (ROMANS 9:6)

Remember, what is of the flesh is of the flesh and what is of the spirit is of the spirit. According to the old testament one had to be members of the physical seed and in the physical LINE of the children of promise according to the flesh in order to be considered Israel. In order to be called children of God.

But now Jesus has become the "child of promise" and we must spiritually be found in his line in order to be called children of God. And who are the children of God but Israel?

Therefore this is how we, as Paul and John, are members of Israel. By being found in the lineage of the child of promise, which is to say Jesus, this by faith as it is no longer according to the fleshly lineage but spiritual.

There is therefore a difference between replacement theology and fulfillment. Jesus did not replace the law, he fulfilled it. Christians did not replace Israel we are members of Israel.

"I say then," says the scriptures, "hath God cast away his people? God forbid. For I also am an Israelite of the seed of Abrahm, of the tribe of Benjamin. God hath not cast away his people which he foreknew. Wot ye not what the sciptures saith of Ellias? how he maketh intercession to God against Israel, saying Lord they killed thy prophets and diffed down thine alters; and I am left alone, and they seek my life. But what saith the answer of God unto him? I have resverved to myself seven thousand men, tho have not bowed the knee to Ball." (ROMANS 11:1)

In like manner he has now also reserved a remnant of the physical seed of Jacob according to the flesh. But this is accomplished through faith in Jesus only and it is them alone who may continue to call themselves Israel in truth, but all others who say they are member of Israel without Jesus do tell themselves a lie. Because it is our faith that justifies us before God and not our fleshly lineage, says the Holy Bible. In summery, it is we who once being gentiles according to the flesh are now no longer gentiles according to the spirit, but are Israel. But those who were once Jews according to the flesh have now rejected the truth of Jesus and are therefore considered as gentiles according to the spirit in which they follow. Which is to say, the spirit of unbelief. And if in unbelief no longer members of the heart of Israel, which is to say Jesus.

This is what the Bible actually teaches us about who we are found to be in Jesus. The Bible does not say that all the descendants of Jacob will be saved. It says all of Isarel shall be saved and whoever blesses Israel shall also be blessed.

Thus, all who bless Jesus shall be blessed and all others shall be broken off. For in Jesus alone comes the inheritance of Israel, which is life. In Jesus alone can this life be found, not within anyone's physical DNA and THIS IS BIBLICAL TO ITS CORE. Only those who worship God are blessed enough to be given permission to be called by his name, and Jesus is God. In Jesus is found both the heart and king of Israel.

This is not to say that those who are of the physical lineage of Jacob may not ultimately be saved. But if saved then they need to be grafted BACK into the tree of Israel. Back into the very nation they were broken off of because of unbelief. But this regrafting must be done by the spirit of faith, and in truth of heart before Jesus. For if membership of Israel still depended on the flesh they should never have been broken off in the first place as their DNA never changed but the truth and error of their heart was made known.

Therefore it is clear to me that God has no respect of any person according to the lineage of their flesh, but instead it is through the spiritual baptism that one receives by the blood and water that flowed from the wounds of Holy Jesus on the cross. Yes, we are Jewish. We are Israel. And ONLY through Jesus can these things be found.

I hope this helps you true Christians out there understand who you really are. You are a Jew, and that is a good thing to be.
