## Horticulture Challenge 2023

Hibiscus Common Problems (notes from "Picture This" and American Hibiscus society)

Hibiscus do best with a soil pH of 6.5 to 6.8 and use of a complete fertilizer. As a general rule established Hibiscus may be given  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup to  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of 6-6-6 or 7-2-7 once a month. They do best in temperatures between 60 – 90 F.

Why do buds fall off?	Remedy
Drought or poor water drainage	Drainage improvement
High-temperature burn	Potted plants should be shielded from intense
	sunlight in the heat of day
Insufficient fertility	Fertilize and water regularly
Thrips can enter the buds to feed	Tap buds against a piece of paper & treat if thrips
	are found
Insects may lay eggs and larvae then feed on buds	Treat early in summer to prevent this
Tips for planting Hibiscus in ground	

## Planting in ground

Best in raised garden beds so they have adequate drainage, avoid heavy sticky soils.

Keep Hibiscus in plastic pot and plant pot and all into the ground. It will be easier to bring Hibiscus inside when it turns cold.
