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ADMISSION POLICY OVERVIEW

Applicants for admission to CCA <u>must complete the 6 steps listed</u> on the "Admission Process" page. Admission to CCA is based on a three-fold standard:

- 1. Parent(s) or guardian(s) must agree to cooperate with CCA in the education, training, and discipline of the child(ren) in accordance with the principles of the CCA Statement of Faith and CCA Philosophy of Christian Education; and confirm a desire to join the CCA community by adhering to its policies and procedures such as the CCA Parental Agreement.
- 2. The prospective student(s) must demonstrate grade-level academic achievement. CCA will consider standardized achievement tests, math and English assessments, school records, and academic references. However, standardized tests are not considered for students in grade levels up to and including second grade. Preschool children will receive age-appropriate alternative forms of assessment.
- 3. Once an application for enrollment is complete and CCA has confirmed a student's satisfactory academic achievement, CCA will schedule an interview with the student and family to evaluate their level of interest in becoming a member of the CCA community, desire for their child(ren) to receive an education built upon an openly biblical perspective that asserts the Lordship of Jesus Christ in everyday living and the authority of Scripture to establish moral guidelines for righteous living.

Families seeking admission of their student(s) to CCA must meet the following standards:

The parent(s) or guardian(s) who sign the CCA Parental Agreement must have legal custody and lawful authority to direct the education of the child(ren) who would be CCA student(s). If the student is under the age of 18, they must be living in a household with at least one parent or guardian. The child(ren) must reside in that parent's (or guardian's) household at least the majority of the time. Divorced parents must provide CCA with a current Custody Agreement or Parenting Plan.

CCA admits male or female students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities accorded or made available to CCA students. We do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, national or ethnic origin in the administration of our educational policies, admissions procedures, tuition assistance awards, athletic or other school-administered programs. It should be noted that although we believe Christian education is valuable for every child, CCA is not staffed to meet the needs of special

education children at this time. Should any concerns become apparent during the school year, parents will be notified and included on a plan of action.

CCA reserves the right, within its sole discretion, to refuse admission to an applicant and is not obligated to disclose the reasons for denial. This right of refusal applies to all prospective students, including full-time-on-campus students and homeschool students. Therefore, CCA maintains the right to admit only those students who meet all of the applicable standards of CCA. Withholding, providing false information or misrepresenting information during any of the application process jeopardizes a student's admission or continued enrollment.

CCA, as a private Christian institution, reserves the right to set its own standards for enrollment, discipline, student conduct, dress, and scholarship. Furthermore, CCA reserves the right, without refunding tuition, to dismiss any student who does not respect its standards or provide reasonable cooperation with CCA's educational process, or whose conduct is counter to or in opposition to the biblical lifestyle that CCA teaches. CCA reserves the right not to continue a student's enrollment in the event a signatory of the CCA Parental Agreement fails to honor that agreement. Re-Enrollment is not automatic; an application to enroll must be made for each academic year.

Enrollment must conform to the standards in the CCA Admissions Overview, including the signing of the CCA Student Agreement and the CCA Parental Agreement.

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APPLICATION PROCESS: Pre-K - 4th Grade

Age Requirements

- Pre-K 3 for 2023-2024 school year- must be 3 by August 31, 2023 and bathroom independent.
- Pre-K 4 for 2023-2024 school year- must be 4 by August 31, 2023
- Kindergarten for 2023-2024 school year -must be 5 by August 31, 2023

Chapel Christian Academy's program is designed to prepare students for lifelong learning by building a strong academic base, while fostering spiritual and social growth in a loving environment. God's Word, the foundation for our curriculum, is taught as a subject and is integrated into all other areas and activities.

Our admissions process is simple, but you must first understand the philosophy and practices of CCA and prayerfully discover if it is a good fit for your and your family.

- 1. Review the **APPLICATION DOCUMENTS** that are found on the website or in the admission packet picked up at CCA.
- 2. Schedule a **TOUR** by contacting us either via email or by phone, where you will leave your application and application fees if you feel it is a good fit for your family.
- 3.Once all the application documents and fees have been received by CCA, you will be contacted to set up a **TEST** time. Although a written test is not required for your 3 year old student, there is a list of prerequisites that must be met for your PRE-K student to attend CCA. (Note: This is not a daycare setting; it is a school with a rigorous academic curriculum) For Pre-K students we will meet with you and the student to review the prerequisite list.
- 4. The **INTERVIEW** can be done on the same visit as the testing visit. The interview will simply be a conversation about any concerns you may have about your child attending CCA and questions you may have about our school. Also during the interview, CCA admissions will address any concerns they may have regarding your child's ability to be successful at CCA. CCA will also use this time to review our

statement of our faith, educational philosophy, mission statement, and purpose of our school. (Note: Because of our limited staff, small class sizes, and rigorous curriculum, CCA is not equipped at this time to properly educate all children with special needs.)

- 5. You will receive a **NOTIFICATION** of the acceptance or denial of your child attending CCA. At the conclusion of the interview, the admissions committee will meet and determine the eligibility of your student. You will be notified as soon as possible if your application has been accepted. (Note: This notification of acceptance does not officially enroll your child. Your child is not enrolled or placed on the waiting list until step 6 is complete.)
- 6. If accepted to CCA, the **ENROLLMENT FORMS AND REGISTRATION FEES NEED TO BE SUBMITTED AND RETURNED** as soon as possible to secure your placement in the school. We anticipate there may be times there will be a waiting list and completing your forms and paying your registration fees are the only way to secure the position.

*Submitting the application does not guarantee admission to our school. Each applicant's file is reviewed and evaluated with our admissions team before an offer is extended for enrollment.



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1. Pre-K and Kindergarten Readiness-

The skills listed below are primarily age targeted goals that should be met based on their age. The social and self help skills are the skills that CCA will firmly observe and use to determine their readiness for CCA, followed by the language skills. Some of the academic variations will be considered on an individual basis to determine if CCA is a good fit for your child and also if we will be able to best meet their academic needs. It should be noted that if your child is eligible for the K3 or K4 program, they will be placed in the most appropriate class based on their academic ability. (Ex: We will have combination groups of K3 and K4 student's based on academic ability, that is flexible and not a permanent arrangement. All PRE-K students develop at a different pace and our goal is to implement a firm academic foundation and begin their school careers well equipped with everything they will need as they move forward.)

Social Skills:

- K3 Plays with other children
- K3 Expresses displeasure verbally rather than physically
- K3 Focuses attention during a story or activity for 5-10 minutes
- K3 Cooperates with adults
- K4 Focuses attention during a story or activity for 10 minutes
- K5 Follows several directions given at one time
- K5 Focuses attention during a story or activity for 20-25 minutes
- K5 Keeps hands away from face and out of mouth

Self-Help Skills:

- K3 Controls bladder and bowel movements
- K3 Attempts to take off and put on coat or sweater
- K3 Feeds himself
- K3 and K4 Must wear velcro, slip on or any tieless shoe options within the dress code if they cannot tie their own shoes
- K4 Wipes nose with a tissue
- K4 Uses the restroom without assistance
- K4 Attempts to button, snap, and zip pants after using the restroom
- K4 Takes off and puts on coat or sweater
- K5 Ties shoes

Language Skills:

- K3 Speaks using simple sentences in English
- K3 Expresses needs verbally
- K3 Responds to questions

- K4 Speaks using complete sentences in English
- K4 Attempts to use personal pronouns such as I, you and me
- K4 Identifies colors
- K4 Gives personal information such as name and age

Fine Motor Skills:

- K3 Colors with crayons
- K3 Builds with blocks
- K3 Manipulates playdough
- K4 Cuts with scissors
- K5 Writes first name with pencil
- K5 Uses a glue stick
- K5 Copies simple shapes, numbers, and letters

Pre-Reading and Pre-Math Skills:

- K4 Counts to 5 or beyond
- K5 Recognizes upper case and lower case letters
- K5 Hears the similarities and differences in sounds and words
- K5 Sees the similarities and differences in letters and words
- K5 Recognizes numerals 1-10
- K5 Counts a set of objects (up to 8)

2. Elementary Grades Readiness-will be given a grade level test to determine readiness for CCA

*While all of the goals listed are fundamental in your child's success in the classroom, the beginning of that success starts with the **social** and **self help** skills, followed by language skills. Oftentimes when these areas are targeted and fine-tuned <u>at home</u>, it allows them to blossom academically when they arrive in the classroom. Your child's academic success will be built upon these key areas.

*Finally, do not be overwhelmed or dismayed over the task at hand, but prayerfully seek God to help you in all that you do to raise your child in the ways of the Lord. Please do not hesitate to reach out and inform us of areas of difficulty and we will gladly offer you some helpful tips. Above all, after hard work and diligence, prayer over your children in these areas will be key.

Attached are 15 verses to pray over your children to help guide you and build your faith and trust in God in this endeavor.

Prayers for our Kids' School Year

God's Guidance and Focus

With the following 15 Verses, may we suggest you pray **one each morning** over your child, and **one each evening**, which will total 14 verses, and then choose a meal time to incorporate the extra verse. Sometimes you may consider praying over them while they sleep which will allow you quiet time with the Lord over that child. In one week you will have spoken all these words over your children. God is a God who hears our prayers, gives us wisdom, and will guide the steps of the righteous.

Wisdom and Encouragement

- 1 Timothy 4:12 Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith *and* purity, show yourself an example of those who believe.
- 2 Timothy 2:15 Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth.
- **Proverbs 4:6-7** Do not forsake her, and she will guard you; love her, and she will watch over you. The beginning of wisdom is: Acquire wisdom; and with all your acquiring, get understanding.
- **Colossians 2:2-3** ...that their hearts may be encouraged, having been knit together in love, and attaining to all the wealth that comes from the full assurance of understanding, resulting in a true knowledge of God's mystery, that is, Christ Himself, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.
- **James 3:17** But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, unwavering, without hypocrisy.

God's Guidance and Focus
