I want to restore family over politics:

Under my opponent's leadership, Dieringer uses Policies and Procedures written by the Washington State School Directors Association (WSSDA) in Olympia. WSSDA is essentially an activist, state-level school board which is politically-driven and relentlessly pushes state ideologies onto your children. WSSDA believes that "Public education is the foundation to the creation of our citizenry".

That sounds good, but I completely disagree. I believe that <u>family is the foundation</u> to the creation of our citizenry. Government schools should not be the factories that produce citizens molded to government ideals. Schools should provide academic education. Molding the values, world view, and faith of children belongs to the family. Raising children is a job for parents.

That is why I want to:

Restore parental authority:

Under my opponent's leadership, Dieringer policies/procedures require staff to hide certain important behavioral (and potentially medical) information from parents if a student asks them to do so – essentially declaring schools preeminent over family. **Staff and student keeping secrets from parents is simply not acceptable.**

Restore a focus on academics:

It simply declares that we will not teach racial division and inequality. In 2022 local school boards were allowed to vote whether WSSDA should reject or adopt this language. Under my opponent's leadership,

Dieringer voted to "REJECT" this statement.

I would have voted to "ADOPT" this statement.

"WSSDA will <u>not</u> support curriculum or trainings that teach students that people, due to their race or background are inherently good or bad, guilty or innocent, more or less capable than others."
