EDITORIAL POLICY OF UNICROSS JOURNAL OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, UJOST

Submission policy

Manuscripts submitted to the Unicross Journal of Science and Technology must be original copies such that they have not been published elsewhere or even submitted to any other journal for publication. If similar or related work has been published or submitted elsewhere, there must evidence of withdrawal of article or manuscript from the former. you must provide a copy with the submitted manuscript. You are allowed not submit your manuscript elsewhere while it is still under editorial consideration at *the* Unicross Journal of Science and Technology.

The identity and address of the corresponding author must be indicated including email address and phone number. If an author has subsequently moved, the current address may also be stated. The Editorial Board reserves the right to retrieve an acceptance letter earlier given for the publication of a manuscript if in the opinion of the board the article contains some legal and ethical questions or that the content of the article is misleading or inconsistent with basic scientific truth, or that it runs contrary to our editorial or publishing policies.

Manuscripts for submission should conform to the following requirements:

- 1. Manuscripts should generally be between 4,000 and 6,000 words including references and appendix.
- 2. Abstracts should be between 100-150 words with 5 keywords.
- 3. Manuscript should be sent in MS word.docx format.
- 4. Authors' names should not appear in the manuscript's filename, when submitting a soft copy to ensure a blind review process. Authors' names, designations and institutional addresses should be in a separate file.
- 5. Authors are to check manuscripts for accuracy of language before submitting to the journal.
- 6. The Editorial Board will not edit submitted manuscripts which are wanting in style or language.
- 7. The Editorial Board reserves the right to make editorial changes to any manuscript accepted for publication to enhance clarity and style.
- 8. Manuscripts that do not adhere to any or all of the above may be rejected
- 9. Authors are to submit their paper electronically by using the online submission or to email to jocres.unicross@gmail.com
- 10. All manuscripts must be typed in Microsoft Word (.docx) and single-spaced. Margins are to be set at (3 cm at all sides) and paper size at A4 (21 x 29.7cm).
- 11. Authors are to make sure that 20% of the references cited fall within the last 10 years.
- 12. Authors are required to conform to the latest References Guidelines appropriate to their professional preference (APA or MLA style)

Author responsibilities

Knowledge that is shared by an author remains the sole responsibility of the author(s). Authorship means that you take both the credit and accountability that go with it. The responsibility of abiding by the ethical and legal requirements of society is entirely the prerogative of the author(s). it is expected that the author(s) were actually the ones who have made substantial contributions to the conception and design of the work including measurements, data acquisition, analysis and interpretation of the results.

While collaborative work is encouraged in research, every author or co-authors must share responsibilities. These responsibilities include:

- 1. Ensuring that the original data used for the analysis retrievable for reanalysis
- 2. Gguaranteeing that the results presented in his work is representative of the original data and
- 3. That you are willing to share your data and results without limits

Author contributions rankings

Authors are allowed to indicate their level of contributions to the current work. This can come in the form of grading authors such as attaching superscripts numbering to the various authors. Authors with higher contributions will be ranked as $(^1)$ while the next will be ranked as $(^2)$ and so on. For example, Ewona, I. O¹ and Bright, T. D.²

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The submitting or corresponding author is solely responsible for communicating with Unicross Journal of Science and Technology, UJOST. and managing communication with all other co-authors. UJOST will not take responsibility for any breach in communication should that arise. Before submission, the corresponding author ensures that all other authors are included in the author list and ranked appropriately. He or she must ensure that the order has been agreed upon by all authors, and that all authors are aware that the paper will be submitted UJOST. Thereafter, the corresponding author acts on behalf of all other authors.

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Citations

Relevant literature must be cited appropriately in each research article to support major claims. Citation manipulation will result in the article being rejected. Peer-reviewers or editors have a responsibility report such unhealthy practices to the publisher. Authors should ensure that their citations are accurate and should therefore not cite sources they have not read.

Peer review policies

Peer review of journal articles will take a two-step procedure - Preliminary and substantive. Preliminary review shall be based on the following criteria.

- 1. Originality: that the content is derived from original findings and research.
- 2. Relevance: that the content is sufficient to add value to the body of knowledge
- 3. Correctness: the formal criteria have been met.
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- 5. Topicality: that the title is a topic that fits into the scope and goals of Science and technology

This decision is taken by the managing Editor in consultation with the editor-in-Chief. The Editor-in-Chief decides whether the manuscript fulfils the substantive and formal criteria for the further peer review process. A manuscript can be rejected at point without undergoing further review.

It is the responsibility of the Editor Editor-in-Chief to handle the selection of reviewers who shall be experts in the appropriate subject areas and requests them to undertake a singleblind peer review. Manuscripts will be evaluated by at least two reviewers who shall follow the general guidelines or template provided for the purpose. The reviewer will make an objective, impartial evaluation of the scientific merits of the manuscript. Their evaluation and comments shall be made according to the following guidelines:

- 1. Relevance to the scope of UJOST
- 2. Originality, novelty, review or short note
- 3. Appropriateness of choice, presentation and discussion of methods
- 4. Presentation and discussion of results
- 5. Relevance to the scientific and/or professional community
- 6. Legibility, style and structure of the presentation

- 7. standards, scientific precision
- 8. Comment on acceptability of manuscript for publication requiring no, minor or major corrections is indicated in the scoring sheet

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
