- i. **DME Supports to Hualapai and Supi Reservations** Providing supplies such as DME, diapers, chucks, concentrators, and more on quarterly basis.
- j. Safety Bar installation In most cases the safety bars are provided by another organization and we have volunteers install them. On occasion we get the safety bars
- k. Clean City Partnerships Twice a year, April and September
- Internship Opportunities Partnerships with Walden University, Arizona State University and now Grand Canyon University for Master Level Social Worker Interns. We currently have two interns working with us now.
- m. Rent/Mortgage Assistance When financial resources available
- n. **Utility Assistance** When financial resources available
- o. **Hotel Assistance** for the homeless needing safe place to receive home health wound care or hospice services. Individuals able to self-care if in a safe place.
- p. Coats for Winter We have a couple of volunteers who collect coats all year long, clean and sort them and when the cold weather arrives we provide coats to the community and to other organizations that provide services and supports in the community and those in need.
- q. **Birthday Cards** Because every client is important and needs to know we care and that we remember them, we have a volunteer who sends out birthday cards each year.
- r. Notary Free notary services for those who are homebound and need assistance with advanced directives and/or medical and mental health power of attorney paperwork.
- s. **Car Seats** Providing Car Seats for families with financial challenges, working together to keep children safe.

5. Future Projects

a. Kingman Caring Home – July, a medical group home for those who maybe unsheltered or have a home and no care provider. These individuals will need home health, wound care, or hospice services and a safe place temporarily. This is not an assisted living facility or a long-term care facility;

however, it provides the individual a safe place with supports and case management to move into a safe long-term option. (Home setting secured, grant application has been submitted for \$15K to cover utilities, will need more funds for insurance)

- b. Drug Endangered Children and case management family supports for sober living options. Grant pending (Need \$12K to get started)
- c. Adult Day Care Grant Dependent, have an application submitted for 5M
- d. **Alzheimer's Support Group** Marcia Joslin going through training to facilitate support group starting in May.
- e. Anticipating need for second vehicle in future
