to accept nominations. All members shall be notified of candidates in a forthcoming election by announcements in the Regional Newsletter one month prior to the election

# DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

- **3.** Insure that the responsibilities assigned to all elected and volunteer positions are carried out in a professional manner in accordance with the club by-laws and policies
- 4. Provide contact information to the club webmaster for inclusion on the club website
- **5.** Represent the club in a manner consistent with its mission of restoring and preserving the Model "A" Ford automobile as manufactured from 1928-1931
- 6. Annually, during the month of April, appoint an audit committee of two or more club members (not more than 4) other than the treasurer to audit the club financial records and make an annotation (signature) record of the task.
- 7. Place a statement in the next monthly newsletter that the task was completed
- ${f 8.}$  Maintain a printed file of the monthly and annual Treasurer's report



# Officer responsibilities from By-Laws to look over to think about running for office! VICE DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

- -- Conduct club meetings if the director is unavailable
- 1. Assume the duties of the tour chairman and plan spring and fall tours or ask for volunteers to assist
- 2. Record and tally attendance at monthly meeting.
- **3.** Order and present trophies, ribbons, plaques and make presentations at the annual Christmas Party
- Collect mileage by the November club meeting on a form provided by the Vice Director.
- **5.** Forward total annual mileage received from each of the member's cars to MARC. MARC vehicles must be registered with the national group
- **6.** Keep and conduct an annual audit of club supplies each February (i.e. trophy heads, club thermos bottles, club paper cutter, and tour supplies such as flags)
- 7. Keep the newsletter editor informed of future events, dates and changes when they occur
- ${\bf 8.}$  Assemble meeting locations/hosts for each calendar year by the end of November and submit to editor.

## TREASURER'S RESPONSIBITIES:

1. Maintain a record of all savings, deposits and withdrawals. (If available, use Quicken for savings, checking & reports)

club secretary but will not contain the itemized treasurer's report

-a list of coming events including dates, times, of the meeting place and general information

-appropriate articles/photographs submitted by club officers or members

3. The editor will maintain a file of all member addresses for all labels and email addresses obtained from the registration form submitted from the treasurer. The file should include

-- birthdays,

--anniversaries,

--telephone numbers, ---e-mail addresses,

--Model A vehicles owned by members,

and the dates the member joined the club, if provided .

4. Forward all appropriate electronic messages and mail correspondence to the director and vice director that pertain to club business or activities.

5. Coordinate information with other car clubs for mutual events and information such as For Sale and Wanted items

- **2.** Maintain the club checkbook. Enter all deposits and a complete record of checks in the transaction register
- 3. Reconcile statements monthly from the credit union (bank)
- 4. Make deposits within one week of receipt of cash or check and file deposit slips in a labeled folder
- **5.** Keep the credit union (bank) signature form updated; Current Treasurer and Director's names must be on this form; Update yearly at change of officers.
- **6.** Prepare monthly Treasurer Report. Keep a copy for your file and one copy to the Director.
- 7. Maintain a monthly updated club Membership Roster. The roster will contain the member's name, address, phone number, e-mail address, birthdays, anniversaries, and date club dues were paid. The roster updates must be sent to the Editor, as changes are made to maintain mail labels & e-mail addresses and to insure that the "Nickle A News" is delivered on time to all members.
- 8. Set out money collection container at monthly meetings. Add money collected at monthly meetings and turn funds over to host(s). Reconcile the amount, if any, due host after collection is taken.

9.Insure annual audit of club records by two or more club members (not more than 4 others).

10. Keep records of what needs to be filed when and of new reporting laws to pass onto incoming treasurer.

## SECRETARY'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Record a summary of the minutes of all club meetings and special club committee meetings and provide a copy to the director and board members
- 2. Provides copies of committee meetings minutes to each committee member
- **3.** Provides a copy of the monthly club meeting to the editor to be included in the next newsletter
- **4.** Retain a file copy of all meetings recorded. File to be passed to next elected secretary
- **5.** Maintain file of all motions passed by club members. Those affecting bylaws should be highlighted and recorded separate to insure the laws are amended and updated each year
- 6. Maintain and distribute a welcome packer to each new member. Packets will contain: name tags for the member, spouse/partner if appropriate, a copy of the club bylaws, and a wallet directory of all club members, a welcome letter explaining when meetings are held and how they can participate. The new members should be told that many club members will be glad to help them with any of their car problems
- Record all correspondence as determined by the club Director in a ledger or on a computer. Update club welcome packet annually
