

On Saturday, November 18, a group of seven members headed to Iola to clean out the library of numismatic and car related books, periodicals, supplies, and whatever from a huge, probably 40 x 60 foot room, that was home for all this since who knows when.

The members included Joe Marx, Jim Hameister, Lloyd Gauerke, Tim Welch &

CDL license and offered to drive the truck to Iola, we'd fill it, then return to Appleton where the recycling firm could sell the contents. They soon realized the contents wouldn't hardly cover the cost of the fuel and truck wear and tear for the trip but were willing to accommodate Joe and the non-profit Iola entity. The dumpster on the truck as I said was a 40 cubic yard variety and it was filled to 2/3-3/4 capacity. Upon returning to Appleton Joe weighed the truck/dumpster combination and came up with 49,000 lbs. Monday they re-weighed and found

the crew loaded 11,900 lbs. from the library. That, of course, is 100 lbs. shy of six tons which is impressive enough but then consider it was done one wheel barrel at a time.


The process was to locate a wheel barrel inside the library, fill it, wheel it out to the loading dock where the tractor with a bucket waited to have the contents dumped into it. Then the tractor backed out, traveled to the dumpster to unload. Considering the bucket was approximately 1 ¼ yards and we filled 30 yards we repeated the process 20-30 times. It was most efficient for me to stay in the tractor facing the bucket and what I saw was six Energizer Bunnies focusing on the task at hand ----back and forth in the wink of an eye.

Very quickly we realized the diesel smoke from the tractor was having a less than optimal effect on the air quality in the building, so I was advised it would be a good idea to shut the tractor off while the bucket was being filled. "Being advised" is a very polite way of saying "how" I was told to "shut it off"!! And, shutting the tractor off and then restarting it was quite a chore since the tractor is an industrial piece of equipment with more safety features than an OTIS elevator in a New York City office building!

This whole process took about three hours including a mid-morning break for donuts and milk. We were having pizza for lunch at 11:50.

All in all, we had a very productive and fun day. Joe Opperman, the Iola Executive Director, was on hand to get us going, give me instructions on the tractor, supply the pizza, and let us know how getting this project off the list in a very timely and efficient manner, was very, very, much appreciated. His final words were something to the effect that you guys never cease to amaze me!!

Being the Iola liaison, I'll add my thanks to you guys for another job well done!

(However, in order to be eligible for MARC National awards, you have to be a member of MARC National. The MARC dues are \$50.00 per year and to be in the national mileage program is only an additional \$1.00 . You must fill out the national form and mail this form to Bill as well IF you haven't registered and paid the national \$1.00 at an earlier time. The form is available on MARC's website.) This newsletter article is a reminder if you haven't sent your mileage in AND if you are new to tracking, it's a help to know how to get started.

This is from our local by-laws:

A major intent of the Nickle A Club is to make use of the Model "A" Ford. The club will award a plaque each year to the members who drive a minimum of 1,000 miles with their car according to the following quidelines:

- Mileage for the year recorded from the odometer and mailed. Newly acquired, completed or previously unregistered Model "A"s may be registered with the vice-director at any time during the year
- 2. Members driving more than one Model "A" may turn in all mileage which will be totaled.
- 3. Awards are to consist of a plaque engraved with the mileage driven and the year of the award. The plaques will be blue in color with the exception of the highest mileage driven by a member for the year, which will be red.

## 1930 Christmas Dinner

Turkey became a prominent centerpiece in the 1920s and 1930s, served with bread sauce, although goose was still popular. Unless you were wealthy, a refrigerator was a rarity, so turkey's would have been collected as close to Christmas as possible. Turkey also cost the average person a week's wages.

What was for dessert? Why, of course, figgy pudding (also known as plum pudding or Christmas pudding). It was/is a traditional steamed cake-like dessert comprised of breadcrumbs. flour, suet, sugar, eggs, brandy, lemon zest, candied citrus peel, spices, and dried fruits (specifically raisins, currants, and golden raisins). please feel free to donate something you have at the house or partner up with another member if you would like. A motion was accepted that the raised funds for 50/50 and the raffle basket will go to a member in need.
