

# Henry, Edsel, and the Model "A" (excerpt taken from Floyd

Clymer's 1974 article by the same name)

Henry Ford was a man of great vision and courage. He was also a very stubborn man and quite opinionated. Ford, brilliant man that he was, tried to force the sale of the Model T for at least three years too long. . . . The three-speed, sliding gear transmission had definitely arrived during the last years of the Model T, yet Mr. Ford stubbornly refused to accept the three-speed transmission as inevitable. He was still determined to push the Model T and, even with some definite improvements in 1925, 1926, and 1927, he found that he was fighting a losing battle. The "T" was through.

Much credit can be given to his son, Edsel, for convincing his father that the day of the Model T was over. Edsel Ford was a brilliant man in his own right and yet his knowledge and sales ideas were not easy to sell to his father

For Sale: 1930 Tudor. Garage space needed for modern car. Old father/son When Mr. Ford finally decided to make this change, there were many long months that Ford cars were out of production and Ford dealers had nothing to sell. Most of them were geared to high pressure selling with substantial overhead. During the lean months between the Model T and the Model A, many dealers closed their doors ---some failed and others quit. Quite a number took on other makes, including Chevrolet, which, with its then modern three-speed transmission and the backing of General Motors, was cutting terrifically into Model T sales.

The suspense of what Henry Ford would offer in his new Model A was terrific. It was the best kept secret of the twenties, and few persons, even those in the industry, knew exactly what Ford was going to do...

Thousands of buyers had waited months and months just to buy the new car because of Ford's past reputation. I recall one instance that



is interesting, in view of the fact that what we now know as "car bootlegging was unheard of in those days. I lived in Denver, Colorado, at the time when the Model A was to be shown on a set date. A lot of teaser ads were appearing weekly in the newspapers. The Model A's were shipped under cover to all dealers and the secret as to what they would be like was well kept. Then a strange thing happened in Denver. A used car dealer by the name of Harry Leeman, who had been very successful with a prominent location on Broadway (Denver's auto row), pulled a real advertising stunt which threw a monkey wrench in the plans of the Denver Ford dealers and the Ford Motor Co.

It seems as though a Ford dealer in Missouri was disgruntled over the delay in Model A's coming and had taken on a Chevrolet agency. However, his new Ford A models were shipped before he had actually put up the Chevrolet sign. Leeman found out about the situation and bought the three samples. He trucked the cars to Denver under canvas cover.

One week before the Model A's were to be shown officially, Leeman ran a full page ad in the Denver newspapers, inviting the public to view the new Model A Fords at his used car sales room. Ford dealers and officials were wild with rage, but there was nothing they could do about it as Leeman had purchased and paid for the cars. Certainly this must have been the first indication of what we know now as "car bootlegging" . . .

Road America has hosted races since the 1950s and currently hosts races in the NASCAR Xfinity Series, WeatherTech SportsCar Championship, IndyCar Series, SCCA Pirelli World Challenge, ASRA, AMA Superbike series, and SCCA Pro Racing's Trans-Am Series.

The track is situated on 640 acres and currently hosts over 400 events a year. Of its annual events, 9 major

weekends are open to the public which include 3 motorcycle events including the MotoAmerica (AMA FIM) series, 3 vintage car events, Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) events, the United Sports Car Racing Series, the Pirelli World Challenge, and the NASCAR Xfinity Series.

Road America is one of only a handful of road circuits in the world maintaining its original configuration being 4.048 miles in length with 14 turns. The track features many elevation changes, along with a long front stretch where speeds approaching 200 mph may be reached. One of the best- known features of this course is a turn on the backside known as "the kink".
