



And this Camel ad wasn't for cigarettes:

Tire repair in the Model A era was uppermost on most vehicle owners' minds. According to TireBusiness.com, "Between the hazards of sharp stones on dirt roads and discarded horseshoe nails, you

were lucky to drive 100 miles without a flat tire." Specialist manufacturers of tire repair emerged and one was written up in the *Saturday Evening Post*. The story in the post said that a man with a pet monkey went to visit a friend's bicycle repair shop. The monkey overturned a can of rubber cement and an acid container. While cleaning up the mess, the men found out that the material came off the monkey's paw in little rolls, which were able to be kneaded into balls, since the rubber cement had set. The new concoction was



subsequently spread on a tire tube as a patch and allowed to sit for a couple of minutes. It stuck! "The tube was inflated and dunked under water. No bubbles." The men realized they had developed a patch that would withstand the pressure of inflation and cured without heat.

Sometime later a 'hot patch' was developed by another company using the prior knowledge from the monkey accident. This process used vulcanizing by igniting a built-in fuel pan, and a tube repair could be completed in about 10 minutes." Shortly thereafter someone figured out that the fuel pan could be lighted with a cigarette. That entrepreneur/company of this new development "named its patches Camels, Lucky Strike, and Chesterfield, after the well-known cigarette brands of the time." The Camel patches weren't made by the tobacco company, but the graphics on the patch mirrored the cigarettes except that the camel faced the opposite direction on the tire patch can and had a different typestyle.

Both companies trademarked their graphics, and the tobacco company, R.J. Reynolds Tobacco never sued for trademark infringement. Popular speculation is that R. J. Reynolds didn't mind the copycat logo because it promoted the use of Camel cigarettes to "light up" the vulcanizing process.

So, you see what a little money business can lead to?


DO YOU REMEMBER?

COST OF 1964 Model A REUNION (held in Waupaca then, now held in Wisconsin Rapids)


"Save the Bus" WORK CONTINUES



Some of you, along with our club, donated to the "Save the Bus" fund at the Model A Ford Foundation Inc. (MAFFI) a couple of years ago; the bus is a rare commercial vehicle with only three known to exist today. MAFFI has now put up the newsletter progress reports on its website for interested folks to follow the progress (See Programs, then Bus on MAFFI website www.maffi.org)

The MAFFI staff working on the 1931 Ford Passenger Bus (330-B with a 157 inch chassis) have paired up with Greenfield Village at the Henry Ford Museum to solve some of the problems. The Henry Ford Museum has one of these old buses, not an exact duplicate, but close enough to help out with recreating some features in the MAFFI bus. So, for example, when the project of getting seats recreated for the MAFFI bus came up on

the "to do" list, the MAFFI staff asked the Greenfield Village auto shop staff to loan out their right and left seats (double seats with an arm on the aisle side) for a pattern. In return the MAFFI staff made new seats for the Greenfield Village museum too while they were at it. It's sort of a fun project to follow. By Cindy Ellenbecker
