Breed Preservation. In this issue of Saber Tails, you will find an update on the activities of the Breed Preservation Committee. The Committee was formed in 2020 when the PBGV was deemed a 'low entry breed' by AKC due to the decline in both the number of PBGVs and PBGV litters registered with AKC. The Committee Chair is Jo Anne Hacker; committee members are Helen Ingher,



Veronica Scheer, and Robert Sweeney. Their goal has been to implement strategies that may result in increased AKC registered PBGV litters per year while preserving the health and character of the breed.

The goals of the Breed Preservation Committee align perfectly with the mission of the Foundation to promote the health, care, and breeding of purebred PBGVs. They have made tremendous strides towards their goals and some of their accomplishments are the following:

- Developed tools that will support new and experienced PBGV breeders. PBGV.org now has a Breeder's Tool Chest, Puppy Packet, and a list of experienced breeder mentors.
- Published Saber Tails articles to inform the PBGVCA membership about breed preservation issues.
- Enhanced communication about the breed in order to recruit new members to the Club and to educate current members. A video was produced that demonstrates the hunting skills of the PBGV. The video was made possible by donations to the Foundation earmarked for Breed Preservation.
- Suggested ways to safeguard the breed for the future. Plans for a PBGV Reproductive Bank and genetic diversity analysis have been discussed.
