PBGV Clinical Database

When you hear the word *database*, perhaps your eyes glaze over. You think back to some data you had to collect for a high school science fair project and you shiver. As a retired research scientist, collecting data and making sense out of it was my life's work. But even I am amazed at the dedication of Veronica Scheer, who maintains the PBGV clinical database.



Years ago, Veronica recognized the value of noting whenever a PBGV owner reported a health issue. When PBGV groups were created on Facebook, she scoured the social media site daily for any mention of a problem. She was not alone in this quest. Members of the Health Committee were her 'wingwomen', always on the lookout for her.

Whenever a health issue surfaces, Veronica contacts the owner and asks for more information. If the owner agrees, the health info is added to the Club's open pedigree database. If the owner wishes to keep the info confidential, Veronica abides by that request. But all information goes into a deidentified, confidential clinical database.

If your PBGV sneezes, expect a call from Veronica.

What does this have to do with the PBGV Foundation? The clinical database has been a very important resource that the Foundation has used to identify new health issues as they crop up. It helps us prioritize our funding of canine health research and to determine which health seminars or clinics should be offered at the National Specialty.

We are very grateful to Veronica and her team for maintaining the PBGV clinical database!
