They would not co operate with us at all-probably because they wanted to sell as many puppies and adults as possible to help offset the cost of purchasing the puppy mill. Our biggest fear is that we will have an increase in owner surrenders such as other breeds are experiencing due to the economy.

The biggest problem we have right now is that we still have no Region 2 rep-that position has been vacate over 10 months! We have a lot of members in that area and I cannot understand that no one will take the position. Now with the list of active volunteers it is really just a matter of co-coordinating and overseeing. Region 4 also does not have a rep due to Jeanne D's resignation.

Melissa Cooper and Julie Shannon deserve a tremendous amount of credit for all their
