her versatility as both a performer and an artist. After high school, she moved to New York City to pursue a BFA in Dance at NYU Tisch School of the Arts, where she performed works by Andrea Miller, Kyle Abraham, and fellow NYU peers. To further her training, Genevieve attended intensives with BodyTraffic, Komoco under Sofia Nappi, the Carmel Dance Festival with Lillian Barbeito, and NYU's study abroad program in Berlin. She resides in Los Angeles, working as a freelance dancer, choreographer, and teaching artist.



Riley Jo Parish is a dancer and artist based in Orange County, California. Riley Jo studied at the Orange County School of the Arts under the direction of Steven Hyde and the teachings of Laura Berg

and Gracie Whyte in the Classical Contemporary Dance conservatory. Riley pursued her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance and a minor in Art History at the University of Arizona. During those four years, Riley performed works by Sam Watson, Christopher Compton, Autumn Ekman, Hayley Meier, Martha Graham, set by Masha Maddux, and Annabelle Lopez Ochoa, set by Chris Bloom. Last season, Riley danced with Vitality the Company, under director and founder Katie Hazard, and the Los Alamitos Ballet Theatre as a guest artist.



Emma Vicaña is a versatile dance artist from San Antonio, Texas, with a strong foundation in ballet, pointe, and classical modern techniques, including Horton, Hawkins, and Limon. She trained with American

Ballet Theatre and the Joffrey Ballet before earning her BFA in Dance from the American Musical and Dramatic Academy. Now based in Los Angeles, Emma dances with Clay Collective and is excited to begin her first year with Benita Bike's DanceArt Company. She has appeared in commercial work, including Knocked Loose's "Suffocate" music video, and her choreography has been featured in films and showcases. She recently launched Totum Mare, a project focused on community engagement and visually driven dance work. With a commitment to innovation and storytelling, Emma continues to push creative boundaries and inspire through movement.
