SWEDISH RESEARCH SITES

ArkivDigital is a paid subscription (free in FamilySearch libraries). They have many of the husförhörs or household records (similar to a census) indexed, and can be very helpful in finding ancestors. They tend to have documents into the 1940s, usually later documents than are available in Ancestry. This is the best and easiest-to-use site.

FamilySearch Nordic Countries Genealogy Research – this group can help with translating entries in Swedish documents: https://community.familysearch.org/en/group/137-nordic-countries-genealogy-research

The FamilySearch Wiki is extremely helpful. Everything in Sweden is broken down by County, then Parish, then Farm name. If you have a parish, but don't know the county, you can find that information in the Wiki. It also has maps of the counties, so you can search for parishes nearby the one you are looking at, as your information may be in a neighboring parish.

If you get stuck in your research, you can request a 20-minute on-line meeting with a Swedish researcher from the Family History Library https://www.familysearch.org/en/family-history-library/research-help

MyHeritage has some of the husförhörs, indexed, and can provide a lot of information that is not easily available in Ancestry.
