

Two sources for scanned church records if you cannot find them on familysearch or ancestry are below. The urls are for the English language version of the websites.



Matricula (<a href="https://data.matricula-online.eu/en/">https://data.matricula-online.eu/en/</a>) has Catholic Church records for several countries in Europe, with extensive coverage in Germany and Austria and more records added continually. It is a free site with no login, but the excellent scanned records cannot be downloaded so you are limited to screenshots. I find the Map search most useful as you can see which nearby villages had records, for example if a marriage occurred in the bride's parish and your village information is for the groom.



Archion (<a href="https://www.archion.de/en/">https://www.archion.de/en/</a>) has mainly Protestant (Evangelical Lutheran) records for much of Germany, with a few Catholic and Jewish books. The search function will let you look up towns and see what records are available, but viewing the records themselves is by subscription. Subscriptions are monthly (about \$20), quarterly or yearly and have downloads available per term (ex: monthly includes 50 downloads). As with Matricula, records are continually added.
