#### Materials include:

- 8" slotted round wooden base
- 10" square notched handle
- 1/2" flat dyed blue (or other color you choose) reed for spokes
- #2 dyed blue (same as spokes) round reed for start of weaving
- 1/4" space dyed reed for weavers (should include blue color or spoke color you choose)
- rim reed that includes 3/8" flat, 1/2" flat oval, sea grass, 1/4" lacer
- ceramic tie-on (actually woven into the side of the basket).

Marilyn will have her creation at the January meeting for you to see.

#### March 9 - Open Weave Day.

Come work on any project you wish. Get help with those problem areas!



A Weaving Odyssey was held by the Central Pennsylvania Basket Weavers Guild earlier this month. I attended along with four members of our Guild. It was a three day affair, with six or seven classes going at a time. I made a double-walled bean-pot basket with Sharon Klussman from Ohio. The inner wall is bright red (and so were my hands). The fancy double rim was challenging. The "bean-pot" handle set-it off nicely.

My second class was a driftwood ribbed basket taught by Anne Bowers from West Virginia. She had set the primary ribs in the driftwood, and taught us how to set the others. She brought 53 (yes, 53! We counted them!) different materials for us to use as weavers. What fun that was, seeing how the different materials worked up!

The best thing about attending a big weaving event like this is to be able to work with different teachers and try out their different methods and ideas. It is also fun to look around and see all the variety of baskets that are being produced. Making new friends was an added bonus. I hope you have the opportunity to participate in a similar event sometime. — Ann McConaughy

### The Country Seat Class - March 15

#### Information provided by Angie Wagner from The Country Seat

The Guild will have three choices that day, a mini Osier Basket, a spiral or striped Little Double Rod Dish. All three are woven from the same materials and the same way. Just variations on the number of spokes, etc. The Country Seat will provide the dyed reed and the willow.

The materials needed are: natural #3 round reed (10 spokes 26" long and bring an extra piece or two-flexible but NOT spongy) natural #2 round reed (flexible weavers) natural very flexible #1 round reed (a few long pieces).

Tools needed: Basket shear fid or awl with tapered shank, bent nose pliers (or regular pliers), towel, and water container.

The Country Seat is normally open from 9 - 1 on a Saturday, but will open a little earlier on that day. The class will start at 9:30 and we should be done by around 1:00. Some people will finish faster than others, but we'll try to get everyone done by then (round reed classes tend to take longer than flat reed). The day of class, students should enter through the solid steel door to the left of the store door. Please park on the left side of the parking lot. We will NOT break for lunch, but there are several places nearby for after class.

The Country Seat can do 12 students comfortably but they can also bring in an extra table if we need it and be able to accommodate up to 16 – 18 students.

### Have you heard the one about...

Before soaking spokes of the same length, bundle together and mark length on one end. It makes laying out the base a little easier.

TIP: You only need to mark the center of one spoke of each length. Use 2 marked spokes as the centers and then just line up the ends. Here's a tip... just for you

Swing handle Pie Basket led by Linda Clifton. Please go to www.llbwa.com/tips/patterns/ swingpie.asp and print out the pattern. Linda made some changes. Linda's is much nicer than the picture. This list has the changes that Linda made. Linda will have some handles available for sale that day. Basket is 12" in diameter x 6 1/2" to basket edge. 7/8 FF spokes 1/2 Ff for weavers and foot 3/8 FF for curls 3/4 FO for rim #3RR

1/4 FF for lashing
1" ash stencil strip
Seagrass for rim filler
12" swing handle.
Checkerboard Carryall by
Patti Hawkins and led by Carol
MacNeil.

It is large, 12 x19 x 8" h. I gave my niece one and it holds a double afghan. I will have patterns for sale that day. 1/2" FF all spokes and weavers some dyed and some natural 7 mm or 3/8 FF for base fillers 11/64 or 3/16 FF for retainer-1 row around base 5/8 FO for rim #7RR for rim filler 7mm or 1/4 FF for lashing 2 bushel handles 4" across closed notch approx 4" long below notch. Here's the spokes so you can gauge how much to dye. 6-- 40" pieces 12-- 32" pieces. Also dye enough 1/2" for 8 weavers.

### Directions to Paxtonville


Methodist Church: Take US 11/15 North, turn left on PA 104 and travel for approx 13.5 miles, Turn left on Paxtonville Road and travel approx. 2.4 miles, Turn right on

PA-3009, travel 2/10 of a mile

and the church is on the right.

Directions to Paxtonville United

You may turn right into the parking lot either before the house prior to the church (There is a sign at that driveway) or immediately after the church - both will take you to the parking lot in back. ### A recipe to die for...

#### JUMBO CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

2 1/4 cups flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon salt

1 cup butter or margarine

2/3 cup smooth peanut butter

1 cup gran sugar

1 cup light brown sugar

2 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla

1 bag choc chips

1 1/4 cups chopped pecans

Heat oven to 325

Combine flour, soda, and salt in bowl Beat together butter, peanut butter and both sugars until light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla. Stir in flour mixture, chips and pecans Using 1/4 cup measure drop dough onto large ungreased cookie sheet about 2" apart.

8" x 8" square handle w/attached oval wooden base

Both the pattern and handle/base can be ordered from <a href="www.daisiesbaskets.com">www.daisiesbaskets.com</a> or by calling The Daisies Corp. at 800-263-4458. The pattern, Garden Harvest Baskets by Debbie Richards is \$4.50 and listed under "patterns". The handle/base is the medium size and is listed under "kits" for \$7.95.

if you choose not to make this basket but are interested in learning how to do the Modified Gretchen Border, just bring a round or oval basket (with an even number of spokes), that you have completed all but the rim and lots of # 2 round reed. The basket needs to end with 2 rows of # 2 round twining at the top (not a rim row) and spokes tucked.




