CALL FOR INSTRUCTORS

Central Pennsylvania Basket Weavers' Guild 2026 WEAVING ODYSSEY September 17-20, 2026

The Central PA Basket Weavers' Guild is accepting teacher proposals for jurying for the 2026 Weaving Odyssey, our annual convention held at the Aspire Gettysburg Hotel, Gettysburg, PA. Instructors who are selected will have classes to teach each day. Classes will be scheduled as follows:

- Thursday, 9-17-26: 2 to 4-hour class (starting at 6:00 pm). A 12-hour class can be scheduled for Thursday/Friday.
- Friday, 9-18-26: 8-hour class (8 am 5 pm) or 6-hour class (9 am 4 pm)
- Saturday, 9-19-26: 8-hour class (8 am 5 pm) or 6-hour class (9 am 4 pm). A 12-hour class can be scheduled for Saturday/Sunday.
- **Sunday**, 9-20-26: 2 to 4-hour class (starting at 8 am)

Basket proposals are **DUE BY February 1, 2026**. Jurying will take place in March, and you will be notified as soon as possible. All submissions must be your original creation.

- O Complete a separate application form for each basket. You may download the pdf on our website to fill out and print: www.centralpabasketguild.com or make copies of the attached forms.
- O Please send several choices for each: 4, 6, and 8-hour classes.
 - 2, 3, or 4-hour class can be submitted for Thursday and/or Sunday.
 - 6 or 8-hour class can be submitted for Friday and/or Saturday.
 - Be as accurate as possible in stating your total class time requirement. Each basket should be completed within the scheduled time with each student's baskets finished or nearly finished. If you know a basket cannot be finished within the time frame, be sure to emphasize that!
- **O PLEASE** include **prerequisite skills needed**, the materials used, techniques taught, and any special tools needed (beyond usual weaving tools) that are not supplied by you.
- O You may teach two baskets with **similar** techniques at the same time. <u>Please specify</u> which baskets; pairing an 8-hour and a 6-hour basket would allow a staggered start (8 am and 9 am).
- O You, as the instructor, must determine your class fee, taking into consideration **ALL** of your associated expenses. We are pleased to provide your lunches on Friday and Saturday as well as your dinner on Saturday evening.
- All selected instructors are asked to donate a completed basket or a basket kit with pattern (for our silent auction AND one pattern for each class you are teaching (for our daily door prize).

<u>CLASS EXPERIENCE LEVELS</u>: Please use the following as guidance. WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND that you include prerequisite skills to help students choose baskets within their weaving levels.

BEGINNER: Has little or no weaving experience with the material being used, and basic skills need developing.

ADVANCED BEGINNER: Still a beginner but ready for something more challenging; understands the basic skills such as twining, start/stop weaving, and lashing.

INTERMEDIATE: Is skilled at basic techniques with material being used. Most weavers who have made several baskets of differing styles and materials will fall into this group. Choose classes from this level that will allow you to fine tune a particular skill or work on developing another. This level is also recommended for students who may be more advanced in other areas but have not made a basket of a particular style or material.

ADVANCED: You have mastered all skills and are ready to try new techniques, fibers, shaping, and creative methods. These classes are for weavers whose skills are already developed in many areas. Remember that you may have advanced knowledge and great skill in one area and yet be a "beginner" in another area.
