Here is a list of what you need to bring:

5/8 flat for stakes ~ 40 pieces at 27" long 5/8 flat for pocket ~ 11 pieces at 16" long 1/2 flat for weavers 1/2 flat oval for rim (pocket) #2 or#3 RR for twining 5/8 flat oval for rim 1/4 flat oval for lashing seagrass for rim filler

The pattern called for a tapered plastic trash can, 45 quart or 13 gallon (one and the same) to be used as a mold. I opted not to use one. Feel free to bring one if you are more comfortable using one.





BEGINNER QUATREFOIL BASKET

Basket size: 6"-7" diameter x 4-1/2" high Bowl size: 7" diameter x 2" high

Materials List:

- 3/16" flat oval spokes (cut 22 @ 18" and 1 @ 14")
- 11/64" flat-oval (dyed) weavers
- 1/4" flat (cut to 3/16") rim row
- 3/8" flat oval or half round rim
- #6 round rim filler
- waxed linen thread
- 6" or 7" Shaker handle (optional)

Weavers can be 1/4, 3/8 or 1/2 natural and dyed as desired. As you can tell there isn't much of a pattern for this basket - design it as you go.

Strip of veneer (any size will do, but larger than 3/4" is best, the length should be at least 2 feet, can

be as long as you want)

Art brushes - #1 liner brush and #4 round

Acrylic paints

Small container for water (a cool whip container

works well)

Paper towels

Please bring art brushes if you have them. Jeanne will bring her own supply for those who do not want to purchase brushes. You do not need to buy expensive art brushes; you should be able to purchase a brush for about \$3 at any craft store (Michael's, A.C. Moore, etc.) Buy brushes for acrylic paints, but not a bristle brush used in oil painting. If you are really brush challenged, Donna Dewberry brushes are fine. They may be more expensive.

If you have acrylic paints you can bring them along. Jeanne will have paints, so there is no need to go out and purchase any. If anyone has a picture of a border that they really like they can bring it along and Jeanne will try to help them to paint it.

NOTE: As we had a small turn-out for the August meeting (make and fill a basket to donate to the Tender Care Pregnancy Center in Gettysburg); we did not yet donate the baskets. If anyone else would like to make a basket and/or donate mother or baby items to this very worthy cause, please bring it to the September meeting. Thank you!

Pine Needle Baskets
Leader: June Blake

June Blake will lead us in making pine needle baskets. PLEASE email or phone Jeff Shields (<u>shieldsj@mindspring.com</u>) **before September 24** if you will be attending. June will need some time to make the bases for one of the baskets we'll be making.

Some advance preparation is necessary for this class (See important note below). The coils of pine needles are held together by sewing, either with needle and thread or with raffia. Different effects depend upon the base construction.

We will learn to do three bases - one that begins with a coil, one that starts with a slice of black walnut shell, and one with a wood base. The pine needles used are very long -12-18", and can be gathered in the South or purchased from basket suppliers. Check with your favorite supplier for pine needles and black walnut shell pieces availability. Many of the major vendors carry them. One source on the Internet to find raw materials as well as all things related to pine needle basketry may be found at The Pine Needle Resource Links: Suppliers and Groups website at http:// www.geocities.com/pineneedlegroup2002/reso urces.html. You will need about 5-6 ounces of pine needles, plus five black walnut shell slices.

(Note: Donna Kumpf will be ordering pine needles and walnut slices from Country Seat in mid-September, contact her if you'd like to order and split costs. Email kumpf@toast.net

June will supply wood bases, sewing needles and thread and measuring gauges reasonably, at cost. This class is suitable for all skill levels. June will also conduct a follow-up or moveahead class at the February 12th Guild meeting for those interested!

IMPORTANT: Prior to the meeting the lumpy growth ends of the needle clusters must be removed, either by scraping with a scissors blade or by cutting off (June recommends cutting these off). The needles must be soaked flat in boiling water for 30 minutes, and then kept damp in plastic bags wrapped in a towel. Don't keep them damp for more than a day or two or they will be mildewed. Dry them and start over.

Directions to Four Square Gospel Church in Gettysburg: Take Route 30 West from Route 15 North or South. Follow Route 30 to the town square; go 3/4 of the way around the square, then 1 block to the right on Middle Street (Route 116 West). (The courthouse is on the corner where you make the right turn.) Grandma Tote - 14" x 7" x 13" high

2 -4" spread bushel basket handles 5/8" FF (stakes & weavers) Stakes, cut 10 @ 40" 7mm FO (stakes) Cut 10 @ 40" 3/8" FF (weavers)

1/2" FF (weavers & fillers) Fillers- cut 6 @ 26" #3 RR (weavers/rim stakes) Rim stakes cut 40 @ 40"

1/4" FF (weavers)

Dye: 1/2" FF color/s of your choice, enough for 5

Me Tote- 12" x 5" x 10" high

2 -3" spread bushel basket handles 3/8" FF (stakes/fillers/weavers) Cut 10 @ 24" and 6 @ 16"

1/4" FO (stakes) Cut 10 @ 24"

1/4" FF (weavers)

#2 RR (weavers/rim stakes) Cut 40 @ 34"

11/64" FF weavers

Dye: 1/4" FF color/s of your choice, enough for 5 rows

Option- can use walnut & cherry wood strips instead of dyed reed.

Dianne Pearce will supply the patterns.

MARCH 2006 GUILD MEETING

March 12, 2006 1:30-4:30 Star of David Basket

Star of David Basket
Instructor: Bob Broome

1/4" flat reed: Cut 9 spokes, 24" long. Dye a favorite color.

#2 round reed: One piece at least 6 feet in length. Dye same color as the 9 spokes.

The following can be dyed a walnut color or left natural:

1/4" flat reed: Cut 12 spokes, 24" long.

1/4" flat reed: 50 feet for weaving sides.

2 round reed: 18 to 22 feet for false rim.

1/2" flat oval : One piece for the outside rim, at least 38" long.

1/2" flat oval: One piece for the inside rim, at least 36" long

1/4" flat reed: One piece for lashing, about 8 feet.

Sea grass: One piece for rim filler, 36" long.

Other helpful items: 8 clothespins, shaver to shape the end of the rims, Spoke weight, and your usual weaving tools. A supply of extra reed will be available if needed.

PINE NEEDLE PREPARATION:

Prior to the meeting the lumpy growth ends of the needle clusters must be removed, either by scraping with a scissors blade or by cutting off (June recommends cutting these off). The needles must be soaked flat in boiling water for 30 minutes, and then kept damp in plastic bags wrapped in a towel. Don't keep them damp for more than a day or two or they will be mildewed. Dry them and start over.
