### 2002 A WEAVING ODYSSEY

Plans are well under way for our next weekend weaving odyssey. Suzette Humer is looking for donations for the goodie bags to be given to each participant. #### Materials needed:


You will need an oval base with attached handle.

1/2" Flat Reed - 26 spokes 9" long

#2 or #3 (your preference) for four rows of twine.

The major part of the basket is chase woven with 3/16" flat and #3 dyed round reed (some green will be available at the meeting).

Rim is 3/8" flat oval, seagrass and 3/16" flat lasher.

Materials: Spokes - 3/8 flat - cut 40 @ 12"

Weavers - 11/64 flat oval

Rim - 1/4 flat, 1/2 half round or flat oval, waxed linen, seagrass Bead embellishments - cube or triangle beads, about 4-5 mm,

waxed linen, tapestry needle Base - 8" wooden slotted

We will have beads available for a small cost of approximately \$1.50. I'm told that waxed linen thread is available at ACMoore and Wal-Mart - probably in their bead departments. If you need a base (approximately \$4) or have any questions call (717-334-9427) or e-mail (bstan4d@yahoo.com) Billie Stanford by April 1.

May 12<sup>th</sup>, Fourth of July Wall Basket. This meeting will not take place at the Library Please watch the web site for the announcement of location.

Pattern is available at www.basketclass.com under free patterns.

Materials: Spokes - 3/8 flat - cut 17 @ 27"

Weavers - 1/4 flat dyed red, 1/4 flat dyed blue, 1/4 flat natural, #2 rnd to twine the base. The pattern calls for flat oval but Maryanne recommends

we use flat. It will make it easier to weave.

Rim - 1/2 flat oval (outer), 1/2 flat (inner), 11/64 flat oval (lashing),

seagrass

Handle - 12w x 19h D

If you would like me to order the handle (approximately \$4.50) or have any questions, call (717-334-9427) or e-mail (bstan4d@yahoo.com) Billie Stanford by May 1.

11/64 flat color of your choice (small amount)

filler row is 1/4 inch flat rim is 3/8 inch half round lasher is 11/64 flat natural

sea grass
