basketbases.com: With the ever-increasing costs of shipping here is a way to save \$\$. If you have orders shipped to your residence, those shipments can add as much as \$10.00 (per box) to your shipping costs because it is a residential delivery. This applies to UPS, FedEx and USPS ground shipments.

A great way to save fees associated with a residential delivery is to have the package delivered to a commercial address near your location.

A commercial address is any address that does not have a residence located or associated with that address. Commercial locations can be hardware stores, UPS and FedEx locations, grocery stores, gas stations or any business located near you that is willing to accept a shipment from UPS or FedEx. Some may charge a small fee.

Going out into the forests and fields, harvesting materials from nature, and sitting down in the sun to weave a basket is my idea of a perfect day! As an artist my passion is create art with all-natural materials that I harvest and prepare from the beautiful landscape around my home. As an educator I guide adults and children alike in connecting to their creative self through the combination of art and nature. I have a background in Fibers Art from Tyler School of Art in Philadelphia and a BFA in Printmaking from SUNY New Paltz and I currently exhibit work regionally in galleries and teach nature and art workshops throughout the Hudson Valley. Saturday - Wild Basketry Sampler: Twining and Twill with Wild Harvested Plants

Full Day Class

5" w x 7" h (everyone's will vary in size and shape) - All levels. - \$90.00

This is an excellent introduction to the joys and nuances of weaving with wild harvested plant materials. In this sampler basket we will use twining, triple twining, and a twill weave to complete a basket using a wide variety of wild harvested plant materials. This includes elm bark, akebia vine,

basswood fiber, cattail, iris, and more. The base stakes will be prepared elm bark, weavers will be a mix of different materials and we will finish with a lashed or a braided rim. Everyone's basket will turn out to be completely unique depending on the materials, weaves pattern, and shape they choose. There will be a focus on discussing harvesting and on doing some hands-on preparation of the various materials.

Tools student should bring: scissors, needle nosed pliers (long, thin ones are best), packing tool, measuring tape or ruler, pencil, a small towel, several small clips, and any other tools you like to have.

^{**}Due to the intricacies of preparing each individual natural material I am not able to provide kits for this project. **

Sunday - Diagonal Plaited Cattail Basket

Full Day Class 6 hrs.- 10:00 am - 4:00 pm



7" W x 7" L x 7" H (Size and shape will vary) - All levels - \$70.00

In this basket you will get an introduction to both the technique of diagonal plaiting and using cattails for basketry. You will have a choice of a flat or a zig-zag rim and everyone's basket will turn out a slightly different shape. I will also go over everything involved in harvesting and preparing cattails for weaving. Great for beginning or intermediate weavers and those who are interested in learning about wild harvested materials. Those familiar with diagonal plaiting or advanced weavers may finish early.

Tools student should bring: scissors, clothes pins or small clips (without any kind of teeth), measuring tape or ruler, pencil.

Kits can be available for this one. Please note that soaking and preparing the cattail is nuanced and I will go over it in detail during class. Those that only purchase a kit should be prepared to put some extra care into preparing the cattail. I would recommend a kit only for someone that has done diagonal plaiting before.

Sunday - Folded White Pine Bark Belt Pouch, Wall Hanger, or Shoulder Bag - Half day class

12:00 – 4:00 pm



3" x 10" x 8" (Each piece of bark is unique and everyone's will be a different size and shape) - All Levels - \$70.00

In this workshop you will learn the ancient art of making folded baskets out of white pine bark with the option to add birch bark applique shapes and a braided strap for a shoulder bag or belt pouch. You will first choose a piece to work with, learn how to prepare it, and then sew it into your desired shape. I will also go over the entire process of harvesting bark for baskets throughout the course of the day.

Materials provided: White pine bark, bark rims (elm, birch, basswood, etc.), twine for sewing and braiding straps

Tools student should bring: scissors, clothes pins or clips (without teeth is best), an awl, clothes you don't mind getting messy or an apron

Kits can be available for this one. Please note that soaking and preparing the materials is nuanced and I will go over it in detail during class. Those that only purchase a kit should be prepared to put some extra care into preparing their materials.

OR Sunday - Folded White Pine Bark Table Basket- Half day class 12:00 - 4:00 pm



8" x 10" x 3" (Each piece of bark is unique and everyone's will be a different size and shape) - All Levels - \$70.00

In this workshop you will learn the ancient art of making folded baskets out of white pine bark with the option to add birch bark applique shapes to make a flat table basket. You will first choose a piece to work with, learn how to prepare it, and then sew it into your desired shape. I will also go over the entire process of harvesting bark for baskets throughout the course of the day.

Materials: White pine bark, bark rims (elm, birch, basswood, etc.), twine for sewing and braiding straps.

Tools student should bring: scissors, clothes pins or clips (without teeth is best), an awl, clothes you don't mind getting messy or an apron

Kits can be available for this one. Please note that soaking and preparing the materials is nuanced and I will go over it in detail during class. Those that only purchase a kit should be prepared to put some extra care into preparing their materials.

Directions to Venues

Directions to East Berlin Area Community Center (EBACC):

From Route 15—if coming from north or south take route 234 to East Berlin. (Heidlerberg/East Berlin exit), PA 234 East, go 8.2 miles. Turn left onto Fourth St., then left onto North St.

From PA turnpike, take the Gettysburg/Route 15 exit, follow 15 South and directions above.

From Route 83 and points east or north, take Exit 35 then...

Head southeast on PA-177 S; turn right to stay on PA-177 (9.6 miles); Continue onto PA-74 N/Carlisle Rd (1.5 mile); Continue onto York St. (0.2 miles); Continue onto Wellsville Rd. (0.9 miles); Slight right to stay on Wellsville Rd. (1.9 miles); Turn left onto Kralltown Rd. (2.1 miles); Turn left onto Davidsburg Rd (0.4 miles);

Turn right onto Red Run Church Rd. (1.5 miles); Turn left onto PA-194 S (2.8 miles); Turn right onto North Ave. (0.3 miles) destination will be on the right. East Berlin Area Community Center 405 North Ave. East Berlin, PA 17316

FROM INTERSTATE 81:

Exit 80 (Grantville), take 743 South to Route 22 (about 1

mile). Turn left (east) onto Route 22, proceed for approximately 1 mile to Gravel Hill Road (green sign that reads: Palmyra 6 miles), turn right (south) onto Gravel Hill Road. Follow for 4.5 miles to white church on right -Gravel Hill United Methodist Church.

FROM Route 422:

Go to the "square" in Palmyra, turn north onto North Railroad Street, continue approximately 1.5 miles to white church on left.

Directions to Giant Grocery store (community room), 3301 Trindle Road, Camp Hill, PA 17011

FROM ROUTE 581: Take exit 5 to Camp Hill; merge onto 11/15 North. The Camp Hill shopping mall will be on your left. Giant Grocery store is located at the end of the Mall. You can turn left at Trindle Road, then left into the parking lot at Giant.

FROM ROUTE 15 (south of Harrisburg):

Take route 15 North to Camp Hill. In Camp Hill, turn left on Trindle Road, and then left into the parking lot at Giant.

FROM York and south: Route 83 North to 581 Interchange, follow 581 West to exit 5 (Camp Hill), follow directions above.

FROM Interstate 81 (Harrisburg and East): Near Harrisburg, follow 83 South. After crossing the Susquehanna River, continue straight onto Route 581. Take exit 5 to Camp Hill, merge onto 11/15 North. The Camp Hill shopping mall will be on your left. Giant Grocery store is located at the end of the Mall. You can turn left at Trindle Road, then left into the parking lot at Giant.

FROM PA. TURNPIKE: Either exit Harrisburg West and take 83 (directions above.) Or exit Mechanicsburg, and follow15 North (directions above).


Giant Grocery in Linglestown, PA is located north of Harrisburg, off of Interstate 81.

For Navigation, the address is 2300 Linglestown Road, Linglestown, PA

From Route 15 North, as you approach Camp Hill, use the left lane to take <u>PA-581 West</u> exit toward Interstate 81. You will stay right to merge onto <u>81 North</u>. Take exit 66 for North Front Street, keep left at the fork and follow signs and merge onto North Front Street. Continue for about 1 mile, turn right onto Linglestown Road (PA-39 E). In about two miles, Giant Will be on your left, 2300 Linglestown Road.

From south of Harrisburg: Interstate 83 North (get in right lane as you cross bridge over Susquehanna River) to Exit 43 toward Capitol/2nd Street. Turn Right onto Paxton Street (not left onto Second Street). In 1/4 mile, turn LEFT onto Cameron Street / PA-230. In 4.9 miles, take PA-39 /Linglestown Road exit. Turn right onto PA-39 East/Linglestown Road. In 1.4 miles, Giant will be on your left, 2300 Linglestown Road.

From East of Harrisburg: Take 81 South. Near Harrisburg, exit 69 Progress Avenue. Turn left onto North Progress Avenue. Go 1.9 miles, turn left onto PA-39 West. Go 0.2 miles, Giant will be on your right. 2300 Linglestown Road.



Big Oval Twill Carry-all Basket

Saturday: Nov. 14, 2020, 10 AM to 4 PM, Gravel Hill Church, Palmyra, PA.

Presented by Debbi Zvanut



This is a basic twill (2 x 2) pattern basket built on an oval wooden (8" x 12") base. The stakes are made with a sturdy 7 MM flat oval reed. The basket is capped with a wooden swing handle with buttons and ears for easy insertion. The basket is finished off with an old-fashioned triple lash (or regular double lash can be used.) The stakes can be dyed. Variety of color choices available. Dimensions: approximately 14"L x 10"W by 7.5" inches tall (to top of rims, w/o handle.) Skills: stakes insertion, twining, continuous 2-2 twill weaving, handle insertion, triple lash, rimming and shaping. Level: intermediate skill level- all levels welcome (beginners will get extra help if needed, but may need to finish the final steps on their own,)

Baskets below are variations by beginners



You may order a 1) Complete Kit (\$ 27. All materials and usual class supplies are provided) or

- 2) \$17 for a partial kit (includes: handle, base, pattern.) & You will need to bring these materials if you are purchasing a partial kit:
- #1 or #2 round reed for twining base & rim row (32 ft.)
- 7 MM Flat Oval reed for spokes. 61 cut in 12" lengths (34 ft.)
- 3/16" FO for weavers (Min.: 98 Ft. or 1/3 coil)
- #3 (medium) seagrass for rim filler (40")
- 11/64 FO for triple lashing (30 ft.)
- ½" FO for rims (2 pieces: 84 to 90"total)

Typical tools are provided by each weaver. Students should bring, if possible: small zip ties (vital), 12 clothespins, garden sheers, old towel, pencil, measuring tape and a basin. There will be a brief break for lunch; remember your lunch and beverage or you can order locally.

Materials fee of \$27/person for complete kit or \$17/person for partial kit, is payable to Debra Zvanut. Mail to Debbi at 8371 Carpet Rd., New Tripoli, PA 18066. Service Project Basket

Materials:

½" flat reed, natural (spokes and rim)

½" flat oval, natural (rim and handle)

1/4" flat reed, natural (weavers and lashing)

#2 sea grass (rim filler)

1/4" flat reed, dyed (weavers or accent overlays)



Directions:

- 1. From the ½" flat reed, cut 10 spokes, each 18". Lightly mark centers.
- 2. Lay out 5 spokes horizontally. Insert remaining five spokes vertically in an over/under pattern, matching centers.
- 3. Square base to 4". Upset spokes.
- 4. Begin start/stop weaving with ½" flat reed. Weave 13 rows of start/stop weaving. The 13th row is your rim row. Rows 6-8 can be woven with dyed reed if desired.
- 5. Cut and tuck all spokes.
- 6. From the ½" flat oval, cut a handle piece approximately 20", or shorter. Insert one end into your weaving along the center spoke, on one side of your basket. Gently insert the other end along the center spoke on the opposite side. Using a small screwdriver work the handle under your weaving until it is the desired height. (you might need to cut it shorter) You may use a dab of glue to hold the handle in place.
- 7. Rim with $\frac{1}{2}$ " flat reed for inside rim, and $\frac{1}{2}$ " flat oval reed for outside rim, seagrass for rim filler. Lash with $\frac{1}{2}$ " flat reed.
- 8. Cut small pieces of ¼" dyed reed to add as overlays on two sides. (see picture)



Josephine Knot Hen Basket

The Josephine Knot is a design that dates back for thousands of years. The unique twist can be found in numerous artistic forms. In this basket the knot is used to form the handle of a hen basket.

Weaving Level: Intermediate

Supplies:

¼" flat reed

#6 round reed

Assorted reeds, seagrass & weaving materials

Step 1 – Forming the Josephine Knot

Thoroughly wet the ten pieces of round reed 60 inches long. The reed needs to be pliable to be twisted to form the knot. A Josephine Knot is formed with two sets of five pieces of round reed.

Work on a flat surface to loosely loop the reed as shown. Start with a loop of the five pieces. Keep the top of the loop at the midpoint of the length of reeds.

Loop the remaining 5 pieces and lay it over the first loop. Carefully weave the bundle over and under the first loop to connect the two loops. Check to keep the round reed flat and untwisted in each bundle.



Slowly pull the ends in opposite directions to tighten up the loop.

The knot should measure about 7" and lay flat.



*Optional Hint – Use two colors for the spokes.


If you use five pieces on one color reed and five pieces of another color of reed it may make it easier to see which section is over and which section is under as you begin to form the Josephine knot.



Step 2 - Separating Ribs


After adjusting the knot to an even and tight form, separate the pieces on both ends. These pieces will form the basic ribs of the hen basket.

Use a flexible, wet piece of # 2 round reed to weave over / under the spokes. The spaces will spread apart as you weave. Weave about one half an inch on each side of the knot.



Continue to weave, working from one side to another spreading the spokes evenly as you go. Switch to wider flat reed and other materials as you weave out from the knot. No longer weave flat on the table. Hold the form in your lap to encourage it to curve and start to make the hen shape.






Step 3 – Inserting the Spokes to form Ribs

Taper the ends of the ribs. Shape the ribs to matching ribs on the other side to create the rounded basket shape. Ribs from each side form the belly of the basket by sliding into the weaving of the opposite side.

One side of spokes will slide to the right of the opposite spokes and the other side will slide to the left of the spokes. Be careful not to crisscross the ribs as you insert them.









Weave additional rows in an over/under pattern, gently separating the ribs with each row. As you continue to weave more rows the ribs will be held in place.

Continue to shape the basket form as you weave. Adjust the ribs to create the desired shape. Do not cut the spokes until you are satisfied with the shape.

*HINT: When you come to the end of a weaver, splice a new weaver by overlapping the new weaver on top of the old piece for a few ribs. Try to hide the ends as best you can on the inside of the basket.

Step 4 – Weaving the Basket

Alternate weaving one side of the basket; then weave the other side of the basket. This keeps the basket balanced as it is woven toward the center. Continue to adjust the ribs to maintain the proper symmetrical shape of the basket. Ideally there should be the same number of rows of weaving on each side of the basket at any given point. Since it is not practical to alternate one row at a time, it becomes necessary to watch closely to avoid an imbalance.

Step 5 - * Optional - Inserting Secondary Ribs

If the baskets ribs are spread wide, you may need to insert additional ribs to fill the space.

If you need to add ribs, measure against your basket to determine the approximate length of the rib. Whittle the ends to a point so that they can easily slide in beside an existing rib. Once the secondary ribs are secure with a row of weaving, adjust the ribs as necessary.



Step 6 - Finishing the Basket

The weaving may fill in at the rim first. Fill in the spaces tightly.

Begin to reverse directions in a decreasing pattern as the two halves fill in.

Continue to weave until the weaving meets in the middle.

Trim any loose weavers.





Big Oval Twill Carry-all Basket

This is a basic twill (2 x 2) pattern basket built on an oval wooden (8" x 12") base. The stakes are made with a sturdy 7 MM flat oval reed. The basket is capped with a wooden swing handle with buttons and ears for easy insertion. The basket is finished off with an old-fashioned triple lash (or regular double lash can be used.)

The stakes can be dyed. Variety of color choices available. Dimensions: approximately 14"L x 10"W by 7.5" inches tall (to top of rims, w/o handle.) Skills: stakes insertion, twining, continuous 2-2 twill weaving, handle insertion, triple lash, rimming and shaping. Level: intermediate skill level- all levels welcome (beginners will get extra help if needed, but may need to finish the final steps on their own,)

Baskets below are variations by beginners



You may order a 1) Complete Kit (\$ 27. All materials and usual class supplies are provided) or

- 2) \$17 for a partial kit (includes: handle, base, pattern.) & You will need to bring these materials if you are purchasing a partial kit:
- #1 or #2 round reed for twining base & rim row (32 ft.)
- 7 MM Flat Oval reed for spokes. 61 cut in 12" lengths (34 ft.)
- 3/16" FO for weavers (Min.: 98 Ft. or 1/3 coil)
- #3 (medium) seagrass for rim filler (40")
- 11/64 FO for triple lashing (30 ft.)
- 1/2" FO for rims (2 pieces: 84 to 90"total)

Typical tools are provided by each weaver. Students should bring, if possible: small zip ties (vital), 12 clothespins, garden sheers, old towel, pencil, measuring tape and a basin. There will be a brief break for lunch; remember your lunch and beverage or you can order locally.



Directions to Venues

Directions to East Berlin Area Community Center (EBACC):

From Route 15—if coming from north or south take route 234 to East Berlin. (Heidlerberg/East Berlin exit), PA 234 East, go 8.2 miles. Turn left onto Fourth St., then left onto North St.

From PA turnpike, take the Gettysburg/Route 15 exit, follow 15 South and directions above.

From Route 83 and points east or north, take Exit 35 then...

Head southeast on PA-177 S; turn right to stay on PA-177 (9.6 miles); Continue onto PA-74 N/Carlisle Rd (1.5 mile); Continue onto York St. (0.2 miles); Continue onto Wellsville Rd. (0.9 miles); Slight right to stay on Wellsville Rd. (1.9 miles); Turn left onto Kralltown Rd. (2.1 miles); Turn left onto Davidsburg Rd (0.4 miles);

Turn right onto Red Run Church Rd. (1.5 miles); Turn left onto PA-194 S (2.8 miles); Turn right onto North Ave. (0.3 miles) destination will be on the right. East Berlin Area Community Center 405 North Ave. East Berlin, PA 17316

Directions to Gravel Hill United Methodist Church, 131 Gravel Hill Road, Palmyra, PA 17078

FROM INTERSTATE 81:

Exit 80 (Grantville), take 743 South to Route 22 (about 1

mile). Turn left (east) onto Route 22, proceed for approximately 1 mile to Gravel Hill Road (green sign that reads: Palmyra 6 miles), turn right (south) onto Gravel Hill Road. Follow for 4.5 miles to white church on right -Gravel Hill United Methodist Church.

FROM Route 422:

Go to the "square" in Palmyra, turn north onto North Railroad Street, continue approximately 1.5 miles to white church on left.

Directions to Giant Grocery store (community room), 3301 Trindle Road, Camp Hill, PA 17011

FROM ROUTE 581: Take exit 5 to Camp Hill; merge onto 11/15 North. The Camp Hill shopping mall will be on your left. Giant Grocery store is located at the end of the Mall. You can turn left at Trindle Road, then left into the parking lot at Giant.

FROM ROUTE 15 (south of Harrisburg):

Take route 15 North to Camp Hill. In Camp Hill, turn left on Trindle Road, and then left into the parking lot at Giant.

FROM York and south: Route 83 North to 581 Interchange, follow 581 West to exit 5 (Camp Hill), follow directions above.

FROM Interstate 81 (Harrisburg and East): Near Harrisburg, follow 83 South. After crossing the Susquehanna River, continue straight onto Route 581. Take exit 5 to Camp Hill, merge onto 11/15 North. The Camp Hill shopping mall will be on your left. Giant Grocery store is located at the end of the Mall. You can turn left at Trindle Road, then left into the parking lot at Giant.

FROM PA. TURNPIKE: Either exit Harrisburg West and take 83 (directions above.) Or exit Mechanicsburg, and follow15 North (directions above).

Giant Grocery in Linglestown, PA is located north of Harrisburg, off of Interstate 81.

For Navigation, the address is 2300 Linglestown Road, Linglestown, PA

From Route 15 North, as you approach Camp Hill, use the left lane to take <u>PA- 581 West</u> exit toward Interstate 81. You will stay right to merge onto <u>81 North</u>. Take exit 66 for North Front Street, keep left at the fork and follow signs and merge onto North Front Street. Continue for about 1 mile, turn right onto Linglestown Road (PA-39 E). In about two miles, Giant Will be on your left, 2300 Linglestown Road.

From south of Harrisburg: Interstate 83 North (get in right lane as you cross bridge over Susquehanna River) to Exit 43 toward Capitol/2nd Street. Turn Right onto Paxton Street (not left onto Second Street). In 1/4 mile, turn LEFT onto Cameron Street / PA-230. In 4.9 miles, take PA-39 /Linglestown Road exit. Turn right onto PA-39 East/Linglestown Road. In 1.4 miles, Giant will be on your left, 2300 Linglestown Road.

From East of Harrisburg: Take 81 South. Near Harrisburg, exit 69 Progress Avenue. Turn left onto North Progress Avenue. Go 1.9 miles, turn left onto PA-39 West. Go 0.2 miles, Giant will be on your right. 2300 Linglestown Road.
