2019 UFO Challenge

Complete those unfinished baskets you have been avoiding, make a basket from a kit or pattern you want to try, or make one basket to contribute to our July service project.

Complete baskets to fit your schedule – basically one basket a month. This year you **do not** have to decide which baskets you will make when you register to participate. One finished basket is due by the monthly guild gatherings held in **March, April, May, June, July, August, October** and **November**. Members who complete a verified basket are eligible for a **monthly drawing for a \$10 guild gift certificate** good for future guild workshops or Odyssey fees.

Hyacinth Basket

Saturday: May. 18, 2019, 10 AM to 4 PM, Gravel Hill Church, Palmyra, PA. Presented by Debbi Zvanut

This square to round (8" in diameter) basket has a sturdy push-in D handle, which gives the basket a "Easter Basket" shape with plenty of space on the sides to decorate with Hyacinth colored reed flowers. There will be a variety of colors in \(\frac{1}{2} \)" F available to use for hyacinth colors. There are 16 flowers, but you can adjust as you see fit. The base size of the basket is made a little larger because there is a diagonal X added to the base to make it sturdy and larger. Dimensions: approximately 8"W x 7.5"L by 10.5" inches tall (to top of rims.) Skills: Start and stop weaving, twining, rimming, decorations. Level: Advanced Beginner/ intermediate skill level- all levels welcome (beginners will get extra help, but may need to finish the final step on their own) Minimum: 4 participants; Max: 20.




You may order a 1) complete Kit or 2) a partial kit. Indicate which one on the registration form

- 1) Complete Kit is \$20. Materials and usual class supplies are provided.
- 2) Partial Kit is \$10 & includes: handle, pattern, green 3/16" FO reed for grass and leaves, and 1/4" F pastel colored reed for flowers. See \$3 below....
- 3) You will need to bring these materials if you are purchasing the partial kit:
- ½"F for stakes, weavers, X pieces and rim row (~500" for 14 spokes from 1/2" flat that are 28" long, two long 32" pieces, &one long piece for rim pow ~36")
- 3/8"F for base fillers (~120" for 10 fillers from 3/8" F that are 12" long.)
- #2 round reed for twining (2 long pieces, 50" each)
- 3/16" FO natural for lasher (180") and 2 rows of weavers (2 pieces of 36" each)
- 5/8" FO for rim ~ 75" total
- seagrass (medium) ~35"

Typical tools are provided by each weaver. Students should bring, if possible: zip ties, 12 clothespins, garden sheers, old towel, pencil, measuring tape and a basin. There will be a brief break for lunch; remember your lunch and beverage or you can order locally.

Directions to East Berlin Area Community Center (EBACC):

From Route 15—if coming from north or south take route 234 to East Berlin. (Heidlerberg/East Berlin exit), PA 234 East, go 8.2 miles. Turn left onto Fourth St., then left onto North St.

From PA turnpike, take the Gettysburg/Route 15 exit, follow 15 South and directions above.

From Route 83 and points east or north, take Exit 35 then...

Head southeast on PA-177 S; turn right to stay on PA-177 (9.6 miles); Continue onto PA-74 N/Carlisle Rd (1.5 mile); Continue onto York St. (0.2 miles); Continue onto Wellsville Rd. (0.9 miles); Slight right to stay on Wellsville Rd. (1.9 miles); Turn left onto Kralltown Rd. (2.1 miles); Turn left onto Davidsburg Rd (0.4 miles);



Take exit 66 for North Front Street, keep left at the fork and follow signs and merge onto North Front Street. Continue for about 1 mile, turn right onto Linglestown Road (PA-39 E). In about two miles, Giant Will be on your left, 2300 Linglestown Road.

From south of Harrisburg: Interstate 83 North (get in right lane as you cross bridge over Susquehanna River) to Exit 43 toward Capitol/2nd Street. Market Style Caddy taught by Becci Melcher August 10, 2019

9-4 at Camp Hill Giant

WHAT: Market Style Caddy, approx. finished size 11" x 19", height to rim 5 ½" While this basket was originally designed as a convenient diaper basket, it can also serve well for picnic



supplies and utensils, or as a handy craft basket to keep yarns, scissors. The possibilities are endless...the sturdy handle is a plus for those heavy loads. Also, the inside smaller basket is attached to the bottom of the large one and has "rim stiffeners" in the rim to keep its shape.

COST: cost for total kit (handle, rim fillers, reed, pattern) \$25.00

If you want color feel free to bring ½" FF for weavers and 3/16" to use for lashing...otherwise basket is woven entirely in natural to stain later or use plain. Hope to see you all there.

Sunflower Basket October 12, 2019, 9-4 East Berlin Community Center





What: The Sunflower Basket which starts with an 8" round oak base that has a sunflower carved into it. The base has two coats of polyurethane on it. The shape is a round bowl. Tight curls are added on both the inside and outside of the basket to make the petals of the sunflower.

Most will finish the basket that day, however the tight curls may need to be completed at home.

When: Saturday, October 12, 2019 from 9-4.

Where: East Berlin Community Center

The cost of the class is \$46.



Turn right onto PA-39 East/Linglestown Road. In 1.4 miles, Giant will be on your left, 2300 Linglestown Road.

From East of Harrisburg: Take 81 South. Near Harrisburg, exit 69 Progress Avenue. Turn left onto North Progress Avenue. Go 1.9 miles, turn left onto PA-39 West. Go 0.2 miles, Giant will be on your right. 2300 Linglestown Road.

In Memoriam

We have recently learned of the passing of long-time guild member Deb Roberson. In her many years as a guild member Deb served as guild president, Odyssey chair, board member, and teacher. Guild members Becci Melcher and Linda Moore remember Deb. In their words...

Debra Roberson 1956-2019 Deb works with Lynne in October 2013.

Deb claims her first basket was in 1983. She took a class with a family member and the passion started from there. Four months later she quit her full time executive secretarial job and became a full-time basket weaver. Her form of learning was to study volumes of books on antique baskets and experiment with producing them until they met her discerning eye.

Deb did classic market baskets to large hamper-size baskets, later she transitioned to waxed linen. Her baskets had intricate woven accents, ornately braided handles, undulating twills and matching lids. She believed in old school weaving, no glue, no patterns, no zip ties, and no wooden bases. If you were one of Deb's students you had one of the greats of basket teachers. She also had a large can on her front porch that you could bring a bag with you and after class dip your basket in her all-natural black walnut dye on the way out.

Deb taught classes in a basket shop in Wrightsville until she opened her studio at her own home. She also taught at the York Towne Chapter in York, Pa.

Deb won a lot of awards with her baskets. She and her husband Jim would travel every summer with their camper and do shows, even taking their beloved Rottweilers "Ben and Tuck". Some of her awards were "Best Fine Craft" in Indiana, PA 5 years in a row; "Best of Show" for 2 years in Westerville, OH; "Award of Excellence" 3 years running in Newman, GA; "Best Traditional Work" and "People's Choice" at F&M college in Lancaster. PA; "Best Demonstrator" at Waterford, VA. Then she was on WITF for a "Limited Edition Craftsman" show, which she did a limited-edition basket, 50 pieces for their 2001 Gallery 33 Auction.

Deb served the CPBWG as board member, member at large, president, Odyssey chair, etc. She was always willing to teach a class for a meeting if asked. She was always willing to help with a weaving problem, pattern problem, or just a "I can't see it." Thanks Deb, for your passion and your willingness to share it with us...

I met Deb Roberson 33 years ago. She was my first basket weaving instructor. I took her classes at Stauffers of Kissel Hill, York Recreation and Parks Association, York Area Arts Guild and in her home.

She was an excellent instructor and probably the best basket weaver that I have ever known. The intricacies that she added to the baskets she designed were unbelievable. I, like many of you, could never get quite enough classes. The first several years I wove with Deb, it is likely that I spent as much time in her home as I did my own.

She did many lovely things for her students. She almost always held a Christmas party with food and gifts for all. Once Deb became a full-time basket weaving instructor, she gave all that she had and more to her students, and gave it with a cheerful heart.

She had a difficult time dealing with the loss of her husband, Jim. Most of the conversations that she and I shared on the telephone were about him and the changes she had to make in her life following his death. I watched as her courage ebbed and her physical problems took over. Unsure of what to do, I merely talked and listened. Alas, it was not enough. Deb wore many hats while a member of Central Pennsylvania Basket Weavers Guild.


The most important role for me was our friendship. I loved Deb Roberson and unashamedly will admit that we never ended the many phone conversations without telling one another that we loved each other. She, indeed, was my mentor and I shall miss her greatly. RIP, my sweet friend!





Usual basket tools – must bring an awl, spoke weight, small clothes pins or quilt clips, and needle nose pliers. (If you have two spoke weights bring both.)



Fruit Bowl 10:00 am-2:30 pm Advanced Beginner and Up \$35

This is a handy bowl is woven in #4 round reed. The basket has two options for weaving both the sides and the rim. Instructions are given for all options. Learn how to start a tight base that expands and how do open work twining. Size: 12" wide x 5" high.






A word about copyright...

HOLIDAY BASKET DAY; It's hat day (with apologies to Dr Suess!)

And a bonus holiday basket: a Christmas Tree!

Saturday, Jan. 25, 2019, 10 AM to 3 PM. Gravel Hill Church, Palmyra, PA. Presented by Debbi Zvanut







The morning will give us time to weave a snowman's stovepipe hat with beads or fur at the top and decorations for the brim. This is a simple continuous weave with a beaded or woven finish. You'll have time to make another if you want.

When you'll done in the morning or in the afternoon, we'll be creating a witch's hat. If you want to make it into a sorting hat, you can give it a folded top or a cute bent top. This one involves shaping so you'll create a tee-pee shape. It is ended with decorations on the brim.

The third choice is a simple tree shaped candy dish, that has a woven rim and an option to add beads to the sides.

All levels of weavers are welcome. These baskets are excellent for beginners, so if you'd like to learn these types of baskets for children or beginning adult weavers, this will be fun to learn and learn how to teach.

You may order a 1) Witch's Hat kit (\$15), 2) a snowman's stovepipe hat kit (\$15), and/or Tree candy dish (\$12). Indicate your choices on the registration form.

Typical tools are provided by each weaver. Students should bring, if possible: 6 twist ties, 6 small clothespins/clips, garden sheers, old towel, pencil, measuring tape and a basin. If you are doing the tree, bring a thin curved needle.

NANTUCKET BOWLS

There are two options



OPTION 1 - SMALL CANDY DISH

4.5" w x 1.75" h - All levels - \$45

This is a good introduction to Nantuckets and features a lashed rim. Participants will choose from either all natural, the classic Nantucket, or natural spokes and black weavers or black spokes and natural weavers. Bases will be of cherry and the plug is bone. The rims are reed. Participants will learn how to insert spokes, start the weaving, and finish the basket with lashing and an under the rim filler.



OPTION 2 – MEDIUM BOWL WITH QUADIFOIL WEAVE

6.5" w x 2.5" H - Advanced - \$55

This basket is for an experienced weaver and features a quatrefoil pattern. Participants will choose from either all natural, the classic Nantucket, or natural spokes and black weavers, or black spokes and natural weavers, or natural spokes and several colors of dyed cane. Bases will be of cherry and the plug is bone. The rims are reed. The quatrefoil may be started at the base or further up the basket depending on the weaver's choice.

All weaving materials, bases, and bone plugs are included in the price. (Sorry, ivory may no longer be shipped over state lines.) The instructor will bring molds and mold stands.

Participants need to bring: *Necessary:* C clamp, basket scissors, micro nippers (those with the blade on an angle work best), Tupperware type container for water, small packing tool or awl, wood scraper, needle nose pliers, clothespins, old cutting board, sand paper 100 grit and 300-600 grit, and any special Nantucket tools you like to use. Depending on the basket you choose, you may or may not be able to complete this in one day. Previous twill experience is a must for twill weavers on Option 2.

From Route 15—if coming from north or south take route 234 to East Berlin. (Heidlerberg/East Berlin exit), PA 234 East, go 8.2 miles. Turn left onto Fourth St., then left onto North St.

From PA turnpike, take the Gettysburg/Route 15 exit, follow 15 South and directions above.
