1	Overview
1.1	The South Yorkshire Winter League Competition is a county competition. The competition
	is organised by South Yorkshire County Netball Association (SYCNA) to enable clubs to
	compete against each other to determine a county winner. The purpose of competition is
	to provide competition, whilst encouraging participation in netball through an open, fair,
	progressive, and transparent league structure.
1.2	These regulations set out below outline the Rules and Regulations which govern the

1.3	These regulations must be followed by all teams, players, officials, spectators, and
	administrators involved in the management, administration, and operation of the South Yorkshire Winter League.
1.4	All teams will be held responsible for the behaviour, demeanour and actions of their

5	Pre-Competition Management & Administration	
5.1	Team Entry and Eligibility	
5.1.1	Entry into the South Yorkshire Winter League Competition shall be open to clubs/teams which has membership to England Netball and South Yorkshire County Netball Association and has paid its subscription in this respect.	
5.1.2	SYCNA are entitled to charge an entry fee to complete in the South Yorkshire League Competition and this must be fully paid in full within the permitted the scales for a team to participate.	
	For the 2023/24 season there is no Entry fee. However, all teams will be required to pay a £50.00 deposit. This will be returned to teams at the end of the season, minus as deductions for any costs relating to cancelled matches (Umpire and court costs where relevant notice is not provided).	
5.1.3	 By entering a team in the South Yorkshire Winter League Competition, clubs/teams agree that. they are able and willing to fulfil the costs and commitment of participation in the League Competition. they will fulfil their obligations and responsibilities as set out in these regulations. they are bound by the competition regulations and 	
	 they are bound by all the rules, policies, regulations, and by-laws of SYCNA, including the England Netball Code of Conduct and Disciplinary Regulations. 	
5.2	Player / Team Official Eligibility	
5.2.1	In order to participate in the South Yorkshire Winter League Competition all Players and Team Officials (see 6.5 for details of Team officials) must be a member of England Netball and SYCNA as a personal adult/junior member participant, having paid the full membership fee due and received confirmation of their membership in advance of submitting the Team Registration Sheet. Individuals may register on the England Netball Membership System via one of the

5.2.2	All players in the South Yorkshire Winter League competition must be aged 14 years and
	over to participate in the league. Players younger than this are not eligible to play in the
	South Yorkshire Winter League.
5.2.3	The South Yorkshire Winter League Competition is a competition for female players. Only
	biological female participants can be included on the team registration sheet as a player.
5.2.4	SYCNA recommends that individuals (player, coach, umpire) if pregnant should only
	participate with approval from their doctor and in accordance with any guidance issued by
	itself.
5.2.5	The England Netball personal accident insurance excludes any loss or expense due to
	pregnancy, childbirth, miscarriage, or any consequence thereof. If, for example a member
	who is pregnant is involved in an accident not related to the pregnancy, subject to the
	conditions of the policy, the relevant benefits would be payable. However, if any situation
	(such as hospitalisation) was prolonged as a direct result of pregnancy, pregnancy
	complications or even early childbirth, then this portion of any claim is not covered.

6.6.3	Due to the limited time available for matches, the rule relating to injury time is as per the Netball Rules, however time will NOT be held for injury

6.7	Kit and Equipment		
6.7.1	Teams must carry an alternative set of playing bibs for use where a clash of colours occurs. It is the Team Managers responsibility to identify any potential clash. Where a clash of colours is identified, team captains shall arrange to toss a coin to decide who shall wear their alternative bibs.		
6.7.2	Both teams are responsible for providing a suitable match ball which should be given to the Technical Officials before the start of the match. The umpires will decide which ball will be used for the duration of the match.

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	• In the event that neither Goal Average, Goal Difference or goals scored can differentiate between the teams, the score in the last match played between the teams shall determine the standings, with the winning team taking precedence.
	In the event that none of the above differentiate between the teams, the Competition Referee shall determine the means of differentiation.
	Where one of the teams has its Goal Average, Goal Difference or total number of goals scored affected by conceded fixtures, then all goals scored by and against conceding team(s) in all fixtures shall be omitted from the calculation of both team's level on points. Except where one of the teams level on points is the conceding team, at which point they assume a goal average of zero and will be ranked the lowest ranked team of those level on points.
6.9	Registration of Results
6.9.1	For all South Yorkshire Winter League Competition matches the Results Card and a score card must be used and completed fully.
	The Results Card should be fully completed and then checked by the Captains and Scorers, to ensure they agree on the result of the match and that the results card shows the correct final score and name of the winning team.
6.9.2	The TEAM NAMED FIRST is required to send a message with the result of the match via WhatsApp to the relevant Results Group
	The message should include.

6.9.3	Submission of the Results Card is as follows.
	All TEAMS are required to submit a results card relating to the match (template available via the website). This should be sent a photo of the fully completed Results Card to the correct WhatsApp Group
	The Results Card should be submitted by no later than Tuesday following the match taking place.
6.9.4	A copy of the official Results Card and/or Score Card may be requested by SYCNA from either team if there are any issues relating to the match, please therefore ensure that you retain these should they be requested at a later date.
7	Competition Complaints Procedure
7.1	All queries and complaints should be directed to the Competition Referee in the first instance, which will be dealt with as follows
7.1.1	During the South Yorkshire Winter League Competition, where the Complaint relates to
	the playing of a match, the scoring and/or results, the relevant team member or Team Official must:
	a) Inform their opponents and the umpires of the complaint.

	b) Mark the scoresheet with the words 'under protest'c) Send the marked Scoresheet to the Competition Referee, within seventy-two (72)
	hours of the match.
	d) Attach a letter to the scoresheet to explain the issue in full to the Competition Referee
710	The Competition Referee will decide what action should be taken
7.1.2	The Competition Referee will acknowledge receipt of the query or complaint and make a decision on the matter within seventy-two (72) hours of receipt of the query or complaint.
	The Competition Referee's decision in relation to decisions taken under clause 7.1.1 is
	binding apart from where parties to the complaint 'have the right' to appeal the decision
	under section 8 below.
7.2	Where a Complaint relates to the governance or administration of the Competition by the
	Competition Referee, such complaint will be dealt with under the complaint's procedure
	of SYCNA.
7.3	Where a Complaint relates to the behaviours of an individual player or team, volunteer of
	individual attending the competition which could be considered as a disciplinary offence
	under England Netball's Disciplinary Regulations, such complaint will be dealt with in
	accordance with the procedures set out in England Netball's Disciplinary Regulations and
	should be referred to the Disciplinary Secretary of the appropriate authority.
8	Appeals against the Competition Referees' Decision
8.1	The decision of the Competition Referee in relation to a complaint submitted in

8.2	An appeal should be forwarded in writing from the Team Manager of the appealing team to the Competition Organiser within seventy-two (72) hours of the match.
8.3	The appeal shall be accompanied by a cheque for £100 which shall be returned if the
	appeal is upheld or if there are any extenuating circumstances. The Competition Appeals
	Committee (CAC) will decide whether the extenuating circumstances warrant the cheque
8.4	being returned. The Competition Organiser will establish a CAC which will consist of individuals that are
0.4	independent of and not connected to the competition. One of those individuals will be
	appointed as the chair.
8.5	The chair of the CAC will send the appeal to the opposing team and any other team the
0.0	CAC believe could be affected by the outcome of the appeal. These teams will be
	permitted seventy-two (72) hours, from the date that appeal notice is sent from the CAC
	to submit any evidence or submission that they wish the CAC to consider.
8.6	All submissions and evidence must be submitted in writing. The chair of the CAC will have
	the secretion to determine the process, procedure, and direction of the appeal.
8.7	The CAC shall meet and reach a determination within seventy-two (72) hours of receiving
	all the evidence and submissions.

8.8	The CAC will notify all the parties that made submissions and presented evidence of its decision and any penalties and sanctions imposed within twenty-four (24) hours of it reaching its determination. The CAC shall have discretion to publish the decision through whatever means it considers appropriate.
8.9	The CAC shall have the delegated power of SYCNA to make all decisions and impose and enforce any penalties and sanctions (but not limited to, reprimands, the deduction of points, fines, suspensions, and exclusion from the competition) relating to the appeal. There is no further right of appeal on the decision.
8.10	The procedures set out in this section shall be governed by the Arbitration Act 1996 (the act) and amount to a binding arbitration agreement for the purposes of section 6 of the Act.
8.11	The parties also waive irrevocably their right to any form of appeal, review or recourse to any court or other judicial authority, or under England Netball's Disciplinary Procedures Manual or otherwise, as far as such waiver may be validly made.
8.12	The seat of arbitration shall be England, the language shall be English and the governing law of the regulation and these proceedings under Section 8 shall be English Law.
8.13	If the circumstances require a decision to be taken sooner than provided for by this section 8, and all parties to the appeal consent, the timetable within which an appeal is raised, submissions made, and the decision taken can be shorter than seventy-two (72) hours stated in this section. In such cases the CAC shall issue a revised directions timetable which shall be binding on all parties
8.14	In order to adhere to the timescales, set out in this Section 8, all communications will take place via electronic mail to the contact held on South Yorkshire's administration for the Competition (as detailed on the Entry Form). It is the participating clubs/team's responsibility to ensure that these contact details are kept upto date.
9	Miscellaneous
9.1	SYCNA will not be liable to any person, whether in contract tort (including negligence) or otherwise for any direct or indirect loss or injury of any nature, howsoever caused and howsoever arising from the matters covered by these regulations, provided that nothing in these regulations excludes or restricts SYCNA's liability for any personal loss or injury caused by SYCNA's own negligence, or for fraud.
9.2	If any of these regulations are held by any competent authority to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the regulations shall not be affected thereby.
9.3	These regulations shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with English Law.
