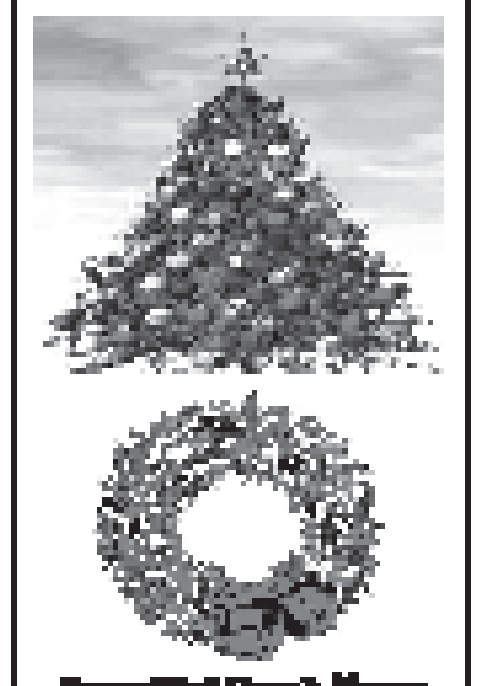

Einstein Cancer Center Receives \$10 Million Grant

City Council member Dr. John Dumbally, medical and professor of anatomy and clinical biology, announced that a grant from the Einstein Center of Medicine at Thomas Jefferson University has received a five-year, \$10-million grant from the National Cancer Institute (NCI) to study how cancer develops and spreads.
