

Setting

Ilulissat, Greenland (population 4,671): where Ilse's parents live

Ogaatsut, Greenland (population 35): where Ilse lives

Belle Rivière, France: village in Provence where Geoffrey lives

Characters

Ilse Erlund (nicknamed "Île du Nord"): 35-year-old translator

Malu and Fa: Ilse's parents

Bea Fugue: translator friend in Paris

Duggan: owner of fishery, friend of Ilse

Val: friend of Ilse, owner of Tipsy's coffee shop

Max: Ilse's former boyfriend of six years

Minou: Ilse's cat

Beluga (Troy Belke): childhood friend of Ilse

Madame LaRoche: French teacher who committed suicide six years earlier

Jann: brother who died in motorcycle accident five years ago

Émile: Ilse's agent

Daphné: Émile's boss and mother of Caroline (fiancée of Frey)

Geoffrey Labaye (called "Po" by Ilse and "Ummi" by Frey): Provençal poet whose

poems Ilse translates

Agnès: Geoffrey's sister

Frey: 37-year-old son of Geoffrey

Clément: local priest and friend of Geoffrey

Discussion Questions

- 1. Describe the stark contrast between Greenland and Provence.
- 2. What are the things of beauty in Greenland and in Provence? Flora and fauna? Geography? How does Ilse's life reflect where she lives?
- 3. Describe Ilse's life in Greenland. How did she get interested in French? What other languages does she speak?
- 4. What is the great tragedy in her life? What do you think she is trying to escape?
- 5. Describe Po.
- 6. What are the sights, sounds and smells that delight Ilse's senses in Provence?
- 7. Discuss the nickname "Île du Nord." How well does it fit Ilse? Should it have been "Lumière du Nord"?
- 8. Language: what are some of the Provençal expressions mentioned in the book?
- 9. On page 167, Ilse says, "I've begun to understand how to live again." What does she mean by that? How is she healing?
- 10. Contrast Agnès with Ilse's mother, Malu.
- 11.In one of Peter Mayle's books, he mentions a conversation from Provence comparing the English (or any foreigner) and the Parisians: "We dislike you less than we dislike the Parisians." Is there any character with this attitude?
- 12. Discuss the character of Frey. What causes his isolation and self-centeredness? Does his indecision frustrate you?
- 13. What is the mistral and how does it affect people?
- 14. Whom do you want Ilse to end up with?
- 15. What does the tragedy of Ilse's house teach her?
- 16. How do Beluga's (Troy's) thoughts reveal his sensibilities?
