Monthly Lecture Programs

Our first program of the lecture series features French chef and author, Jacky Pluton on September 15. He will speak on the topic of « La Qualité gastronomique entre la France et les Etats-Unis. » On October 20, Eric Aubriot, chef and proprietor of TASTE Food and Wine in Rogers Park, will describe his experiences as a small business entrepreneur. Aubriot apprenticed under Chef Alain Ducasse at the George V hotel in Monaco, a Michelin Three-Star restaurant on the French Riviera. On

November 17, Wylie Crawford, carillionneur at the University of Chicago, will speak about carillons and his experiences as a bell ringer.

The themes of other francophone programs this year tentatively include cabaret and classical music and Quebec cinema. Caroline Erbmann, Vice-president in charge of programs, organizes the series of lectures and programs scheduled during the academic year.

Café Conversation

The wider francophone community is invited to join our members for two monthly Café-Conversation events, one on a Monday morning and the second on a Monday evening, all year around. There is no charge for participating in one of several animated conversations occurring during the hour. The events are open to French speakers from beginners to native speakers.

French Class

The Alliance du North Shore offers one course of French lessons for students who speak French fluently but would like to increase their vocabulary and perfect their knowledge of grammar. The class meets Wednesday evenings from 7:00 p.m. to 8:45 p.m. Students

read and analyze articles and poems and complete grammar worksheets. They also discuss current events. The class size is 8 minimum and 12 maximum. Roland DuBosq, a retired French teacher from Evanston Township High School, continues as instructor for the class.

The fall session extends from September 10 through November 19. The winter session continues December 3-February 25 (no classes November 26, December 24 and 31) and the last session starts March 4 and ends on May 13. The cost per 11-week session is \$154.00, with no refund for missed classes. Students must be members of the Alliance Française du North Shore. Registration for the course is indicated on the membership form. If seats are still available, students may join the class for a prorated tuition.
