

MISSION STATEMENT

New Mercy Care Schools support orphans, vulnerable, and less fortune children of Mathare slums in Nairobi, Kenya by providing them basic needs in terms of Education, Food, and Medicine.



BACKGROUND

New Mercy Care Schools educate, feed, and take care of children from less fortunate families, orphans, and those affected or infected with HIV/AIDS/COVID -19 from Mathare Slums of Nairobi, Kenya. Our ministry also takes care of health issues of children and ensures healthy life for the children under our care.

New Mercy Care Schools educate more than 250 children from the age of 3-18 years, catering for all their educational needs until they complete their Secondary education level. After the children reach the age of 3 years, they always have an institution which takes care of their educational needs

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which are very necessary. All the children are under the care of teachers depending on their level of education. The teachers teach, guide, counsel and encourage these children in biblical way.

We believe that children grow, learn, and prosper best in a school environment where they can learn about God, themselves, others, the family and life and get a chance to learn and practice Christian values. Our goal is to have a school and a family for them and to surround them with adults who love, care, and support them, so they grow into their God given potential and to help them overcome any challenges and problems.



STRENGTHS

The school New Mercy Care Schools is unique because it offers non-denominational Christian based, children educational services for less fortunate and orphan children. We seek to surround them with adults, who will love and care for them. We want the children to grow into their God given potential without feeling disadvantaged for starting educational life on the wrong footing. We are committed to providing education to these children from the Board of directors, down to the supporting staff. We are all about the children.



ENROLLMENT

During the academic year 2022-2023, the number of pupils stands at 250. In pre-school there are ninety three (93), seventy seven (77) pupils in primary school, and eighty (80) in secondary school.



PRE-SCHOOL

The pre-school comprises of the play group, pre-primary one and pre-primary. 93 pupils in this section are between the ages of 3-6 years old. There are notable achievements in terms of academic, feeding and health care. Pupils have developed holistically that is physically, emotionally, socially, spiritually, and psychologically. Pupils are able to read, speak and write.

Teachers in this section include Millicent, Valentine, and Mercy.



PRIMARY SCHOOL

The primary school comprises of Grade 1-7 and class 8. The total number of pupils is 77. We had 21 candidates who already finished their final exams [Kenya Certificate Primary Education]. All the candidates scored very well and proceeded to secondary school. 15 of them scored above 300 marks out of possible 500 marks and the rest scored above 250 marks.

The section comprises of nine teachers. Eight female teachers and one male teacher. We also have one cook Ms. Sheila Musoliza and the Executive Director Mr. Joseph Kioko who is in charge of the whole institution.



SECONDARY SCHOOL

The secondary school comprises of form 1 - 4. The section has 80 students. There are seven teachers. Six female teachers and one male teacher. We had 22 candidates who already finished their final exams (Kenya Certificate Secondary Education). Ten of the candidates are qualified to enter universities, and the rest are qualified to enter tertiary colleges.



ACADEMIC REPORT

The core value of the school is to help the children in mathare slums to achieve their goals in life by becoming what they are longing to be in future. The results have been compiled by Ms Risper Mbithe and Ms Agnes Kieti. The overall performance of the pupils and students as from baby class this term is as follows:

SPORTS AND GAMES

Pupils have been perfecting their given talents every two Fridays in a month at Kenya Methodist University [KEMU]. Sports and games help children to develop holistically and break class monotony. Play also helps children in learning through fun and games. Pupils are also able to socialize well, develop language, and express their emotions.



GUIDANCE AND COUNCELLING

The guidance has been successful throughout the year; Teachers have been guiding and counseling pupils through the word of God. Through the help of committed teachers, pupils have learnt more through these sections. Pupils are able to express their feelings by sharing and are able to learn how to solve problems by creative and in making decisions. Pupils are able to learn life skills such as skills of knowing and living with oneself, skills of knowing and living with others etc.

FEEDING PROGRAMME

We have one cook who helps with cooking. She is committed such that porridge and food have been effectively cooked and on time. The school management has tried to make sure that food is well balanced though is a big challenge due to lack of funds. We thank all who have involved in contributing food for these young children.



CLINIC REPORT

The department is held by Tr Linet Maina. She has been doing very well. She is able to give first aids and treat minor sickness. We also thank all who are involved to make sure all goes well in this department.

The school had parents' meeting where modalities of paying little fees of ksh.1000 per term were discussed as well as how to improve the performance of the children. 


