This new year let us set our goals not only on physical exercise but to "work out our salvation with fear and trembling," not only to healthy food choices but also to choose to consume that spiritual food of the Scriptures, and not to simply knocking off our bad habits but to breaking off our superfluities. Remembering that we are not our own and are thus not leading our own lives nor building a world for ourselves, we need set our intentions for the noble and glorious purpose of divesting our minds and consciences of all vice. And yes, this will include all leftovers of lost religions and long-forgotten gods who's ways and means we may still be keeping alive unawares.

"Wash your hands, you sinners," said the Apostle, "purify your hearts, you double-minded men." James wrote these words in echo of his brother, "Yeshua", our Master, who told us we cannot serve two masters, and yet we have been trying so very hard to do so for so many centuries, mostly by using the heathen holidays of pagan gods to worship our holy Elohim of the Hallowed NAME.

Take this very celebration for example. Yes it is the dawn of a new day, the rolling over of another secular year, the changing of the calendar, but the party itself, from ancient time, has ever belonged to the false god whose own name disgraces this, the first month of the year - January. As Janus was thought to be co-ruler of Italy with Saturn, the Titan exile of the sky, today Janus is most often depicted as "baby new year" and closely followed by an old bearded man in a cloak carrying a scythe. Sound familiar? All babies born on his day were dedicated to him, and his day was commemorated with wishes and aspirations for accomplishments throughout the year.

And yet this is far from the only holiday we've hijacked from heathens. We've been aping pagans for ages now, keeping the day of Sol Invictus Mithra called Sunday, the festival of Yule we call Christmas, the fertility rite called Lupercalia now known as Valentine's Day which honors Faunus, and the Anglo-Saxon Easter as the Christian Passover.
