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March and the Busy Season Begins

The WMF began the 2023 season by attending the WA Middle School's STEAM Night! We set up the WMF's Mobile Educational Exhibit and had a wonderful time visiting with students, teachers, and parents. Thank you so much for having us at your event.

The next scheduled event was spending 2 days at Selah High School's Mr. Soto's Science Applications in the Yakima Valley classes. Day one the classes were given a presentation on the history of the Wenas Mammoth Dig Site. Day two was spent outside with hands-on activities that included exposing bones using soft brushes, identifying, and drawing the bones on forms. The second activity students measured a mammoth humerus bone, mammoth rib bone, and a cave bear femur, then drawing the bones on a form with measurements.

The following week, the WMF returned to Mr. Soto's classes to give a short presentation on careers in Geosciences in the Yakima Valley. Eric Neumeyer from the Selah Wastewater Treatment Plant also shared information on how the plant processes wastewater and related career fields. Thank you, Mr. Soto, for inviting us.
