Laurel Mountain Winery is celebrating 30 years of business in 2025. Established in 1995 by late wine enthusiast, John Nordberg. The winery is a refurbished barn that features a wine tasting bar with a unique gift shop. Additionally, the property has an Antique Tool Museum featuring historical items from our generational family farm in Driftwood. Settled on 50 acres with a large pond out front, the beautiful country setting compliments the family friendly atmosphere.

Nordberg and his family enjoyed growing a small vineyard in Driftwood, but soon realized it was cheaper to buy juice for our wine from the Erie region. He inspired his family, and they continue to use the recipes he created. Now owned by daughter Victoria Tretick, and her wine-making husband, Michael Tretick, after the late passing of Barbara Nordberg, it is important to their family to keep his legacy flowing. Grandchildren Taylor Tretick, manager of the Benezette Wines location, and Myer Tretick, have plans to further the business; truly making it a small family business.

Their popular Sunset Events, where they host live music and food trucks in the summer months, have grown tremendously over the years. They have become a huge success and a whole lot of fun. They also bring out the family's 100-year-old apple press in the fall for a Cider Press Event. "We like to make sure we can include

people of all ages at our events for the best family time" Vicki always says. This is Jefferson County's first and only cider pressing event.

Expanding the wine selection has proved to be a challenging but rewarding effort. Tretick has taken on the role of winemaker since 2014. "The winery used to produce 12,500 gallons of wine a year by hand, but since we introduced an updated assembly line for bottling, we have surpassed our goals" states Tretick. His favorite wine to make is Blackberry Port, a must-try.

Some of the more popular wines that have been around since the beginning are Laurel Blush, Rattlesnake Red, & Steel City Red. One favorite story was the creation of Rhuberry, a strawberry-rhubarb blended wine. Nordberg had too much rhubarb in the garden one year and what does a wine maker do with an overstock of vegetables? Make wine with it of course!

A life member of the Pine Creek Volunteer Fire Department since 1991, Mr. McCracken has earned over fifty-five training certificates and has held ranks including Lieutenant, Captain, and Assistant Chief. His contributions extend to establishing the department's Quick Response Service and training countless emergency responders throughout western Pennsylvania.

Beyond emergency services, Mr. McCracken has played a crucial role in public safety efforts across Jefferson County. As a Reserve Deputy with the County Jefferson Sheriff's Office since 2006, he has completed numerous advanced certifications, including Advanced Tactical Medic and SWAT School. His dedication to training others led him to develop the Stop the Bleed program for




During the celebration, the Elcam facility also offered free tours of the distribution center that will store and ship products developed through this new program.

If you live in or have visited a big city, you've probably run into street vendors people sell who everything from hot dogs to umbrellas on the

and streets sidewalks. Many of these entrepreneurs sell completely unrelated products, such as coffee

and ice cream. At first glance, this approach seems a bit odd, but it turns out to be quite clever. When the weather is cold, it's easier to sell hot cups of coffee. When the weather is hot, it's easier to sell ice cream. By selling both, vendors reduce the risk of losing money on any given day.

Asset Allocation

Trail Central: \$183.9 Million in Visitor Spending Impacts McKean County's Economic Growth, Creates Job and Enhances Quality of Life







Rattlesnake Creek Stream Improvement Project

by The Jefferson County Conservation District

Rattlesnake Creek Brockway, PA is undergoing a stream improvement June-September 2025. The purpose of the project is to enhance critical fishing habitat while simultaneously protecting the streambanks from further erosion. Streambank erosion results in the loss of large amounts of land over time which contributes to sediment pollution. Fortunately, there are practices that are available to mitigate streambank erosion and also improve fish habitat. The practices being implemented throughout Rattlesnake Creek involve the use of heavy equipment in and along the stream. Logs and stone are reinforced into the streambank by the excavator and then held into place by rebar. There are a variety of structures being implemented that each depend on a stream characteristics in any given reach. Once the structures are put into place, the adjacent floodplain is planted with shrubs and livestakes to be revegetated and to hold the soil intact. The floodplain, or the adjacent land to a stream, should be fully vegetated with trees and shrubs that contain deep root systems to hold soil together. Lawn grass roots are only as deep as the grass is high, so it is recommended to create a "no-mow" zone from the stream edge. The primary project sites are located parallel along the stream to U.S. Route 219. If you live along Rattlesnake Creek and think that this is a project

that can be implemented on your property, contact the Jefferson Conservation District at 814-849-7463, you may qualify for available funding. Most work along the streambank will require permitting so please reach out to your local conservation district or the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) before trying anything on your own. Below is an example of one of the fish habitat and streambank stabilization structures constructed along Rattlesnake Creek in the summer of 2024.
