Public Policy & Advocacy: New Ohio Dyslexia Support Law Requirements

The Ohio Dyslexia Committee has determined that teachers must complete 18 professional development instructional hours that align with the new dyslexia guidebook requirements. This includes Teachers of the Visually Impaired. The public policy committee received clarification from ODE regarding PD deadlines. Please see the schedule given to us from the Dyslexia Administrator:

Dyslexia Professional Development Requirements

Any intervention specialist serving students in grades K-12 must complete the PD requirement. The timeline varies by age band, however. Those serving students in K-1 should complete by the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year, those serving students in grades 2-3 should complete by the beginning of the 2024-2025 year, and those serving students in grades 4-12 should complete by the beginning of 2025-2026 year.

Assessing CVI



Have you used the **Austin Assessment** as a CVI screener for students?

The Austin Assessment is a fun and simple card matching game that is also a screening tool for cerebral

visual impairment (CVI) related visual issues.

The Austin Assessment Pro App is for professionals wanting to screen multiple children. This includes teachers, therapists, clinicians and researchers. Along with the screenings, you get corresponding reports and access to the online dashboard for professionals where you can search for reports and export data as a .CSV file. The Austin Assessment for professionals can be used on multiple devices by multiple people.



They added smaller screening packages if you want to try it before making a larger purchase. You can purchase 10 screenings for \$34.

Dan Kelley recently had the opportunity to review both devices and shared that it truly felt like something special to feel animations in braille and have instant access to the tactile graphic. In Ohio, Tactile Engineering has made it presence known with the Cadence when they visited the Ohio State School for the Blind/ODBES in March. After receiving some initial training with the device and the computer interface, Dan was able to showcase multiline braille during Ohio Governor Mike DeWine's visit to the OSSB campus. Currently, OSSB and state-wide services are planning to delve into this new technology and share with colleagues and students around the state. Stay tuned!
