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Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the
 applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the
 institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an
 examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination
 available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

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- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL: You have the right to cancel the Enrollment Agreement you signed for a course of instruction including any equipment, such as books, materials, and supplies, or any— other goods and services included in the agreement,

and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

A student must withdraw or cancel by (Date)___/___, before the student completes 60 percent of the attendance period, in order to receive the pro-rate refund according the Refund Table. A student will not be eligible for a refund, if the student withdraws or cancels after the 60.1 percent of the attendance period. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation at the address of the school shown on the top of the front page of the Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by mail or hand delivery. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective on the posted date. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by your Enrollment Agreement. You will be given a Notice of Cancellation form with this Enrollment Agreement to be used for your convenience.

If the school has given you any equipment, including books or other materials, you shall return it to the school on the date of your notice of cancellation. If you fail to return this equipment, including books, or other materials, in good condition on the day of cancellation, the school may deduct its documented cost for the equipment from any refund that may be due you. Once you pay for the equipment, it is yours to keep without further obligation.

REMEMBER: You must cancel in writing. You do not have the right to cancel just by telephoning the School or by not coming to class. Refunds will be impacted by your delay.

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
