# **Masanosuke Fujino**

**1890 -1945**

**Masanosuke Fujino emigrated from Kyoto, Japan in 1913 at the age of 24. He would marry Matsuko Matsuno in 1919. Their daughter, Chiyoko, was born two years later.**

**Chiyoko married in August 1943 and then transferred to Tule Lake with her new husband the following month.**

**Masanosuke Fujino was the last person to die in Topaz on October 16, 1945. The camp would close a little over two weeks later on October 31, 1945. It is unknown if he was able to see Chiyoko again before he died.**
