### **DENICHI NAGATA**

The body of Denichi Nagata, 55, cook at the Japanese relocation center at Topaz, Millard county, who died in a Salt Lake City hospital Monday of cancer, has been shipped to the Aultorest mortuary in Ogden for cremation.

Mr. Nagata was born Dec. 22, 1887, in Ttori, Japan, a son of Jisaburo and Sei Moritani Nagata. He is survived by his widow, Haruko Nagata.

The remains will be returned to Topaz.
