

Square Dance in Sweden

- Square Dance came to Sweden in the late 1970's via Brazil and Saudi Arabia
- Many clubs date back to the early 80's

2020

- SAASDC (Swedish Association of American Square Dance Clubs) organizes 3346 dancers in 108 clubs
- SACT (Swedish Association of Callers and Teachers)
 has 75 members. There are no professional callers.

 Square Dance clubs are owned by the members and run by a board.
 Quite often, but not always, the main caller will attend the board meetings.



 The club organizes courses and dances and hires callers for the different events.

Being a member of a club gives you accident insurance.

 A club night usually lasts for 3 hours with different levels before and after the 20 minute coffee break.



 We have a lot of single dancers, mostly women, so quite a few learn to dance as left hand dancers.

 We only dance Square dance so we get in quite a few tips each evening.

- We dedicate <u>one year each</u> to Basic, Mainstream and Plus.
- We graduate our dancers after Basic.
- Dancers are expected to be able to dance 1/2 sachayed and to dance calls from many different positions before they learn a new level.
- All calls are taugth according to Callerlab definitions.
- After all the calls have been taught the lessons are used for "dansträning" i.e. dance training.
