SAMUEL'S SANCTUARY MINISTRIES

Samuel's Sanctuary Ministries (SSM) is a registered Belizean Christian non-profit ministry started in 2011. Our vision is to minister the Love of God and the Word of God to at-risk children and adults of Belize and mission teams who serve with us. SSM now encompasses three separate ministries working together to establish a sustainable, long-term, loving legacy in Belize.

Samuel's Sanctuary is an 18+ acre Mission Team Hosting Facility as well as Retreat Center for Belizean groups. It is located in the Maya Mountains of Central Belize on the scenic Hummingbird Hwy. 20 miles south of the capital Belmopan. We have a full-service facility capable of accommodating up to 45 people with Dormitories, Cabins, Kitchen, Dining/Meeting Hall, and Hang-out areas, surrounded by tropical rain forests with a beautiful river flowing through the property. Meals are provided onsite by acclaimed 5-star chefs.

The Country Barn is a Christian non-profit Business as Missions 45+ acre working dairy farm, shop, and restaurant. Homemade products such as ice cream, yogurt, and cheese, are made daily with our fresh milk. In our Cafe, award winning chefs Juan & Marina Rosales serve up classic favorites with a tropical twist. The Country Barn employs young men and women from our local village with the goal of providing them with a steady wage, on-the-job skills training, and discipleship through daily Bible studies.

Two-Can Ministries is focused on providing for the physical and spiritual needs of St. Margaret's our local UN refugee village, primary school, and other ministries to at-risk children and adults in Belize. This includes evangelism/discipleship, pastor/leader training, water wells, food distribution, medical, construction, and literacy programs to name a few.



MISSION TRIP FAQ'S

Q: WHAT IS THE WEATHER LIKE IN BELIZE?

A: Belize is a tropical climate with an average temperature of 85°F during the day and 75°F at night with 85% humidity. Rainy Season is June-January and February-May is considered Dry Season.

Q: WHAT IS THE CURRENCY? WILL I NEED TO EXCHANGE MONEY?

A: The Belize dollar has a set exchange rate of \$1US=\$2BZ dollars. There is no need to exchange money as US dollars are accepted everywhere.

Q: DO I NEED TO SPEAK ANOTHER LANGUAGE?

A: While Belize is home to many cultures and languages, the official language is English. Our local UN refugee village of St. Margaret's is home to people from Guatemala, El Salvador, and Honduras. We provide Spanish translators when necessary for church services and outreaches, but most people you meet will be able to speak at least some English.

Q: WHAT WILL I BE DOING ON THE MISSION TRIP?

A: While every trip is different based on the skills and goal of the team, you can expect to do outreach and/or work projects and enjoy an adventure day.

MISSION TRIP FAQ'S CONT.

Q: HOW SHOULD I DRESS WHILE IN BELIZE?

A: The culture in our village judges whether a person is a Christian or not based on how they dress. We ask that girls not wear shorts and that skirts/dresses be knee length or longer. We encourage everyone to wear lightweight pants and long sleeve shirts for sun/bug protection.

Q: CAN I BRING ELECTRONICS AND WILL I HAVE ACCESS TO WIFI?

A: Your mission trip is an opportunity to "unplug" and focus on God and others. Please bring only necessary electronics. Team leaders will have access to limited wi-fi at Samuel's Sanctuary and The Country Barn and team members in case of emergency.

Q: WHY SHOULD I BRING REEF-FRIENDLY SUNSCREEN AND NON-TOXIC BUG SPRAY?

A: Belize is home to the world's 2nd largest barrier reef and miles of tropical rainforest; we would like to do our part to protect them and the health of your team members and hosts.

Q: CAN I BRING GIFTS TO THE BELIZEANS?

A: Please ask for authorization from your host family before bringing or giving gifts.
