We began the month with something we have never done before, handing out candy and tracts on Halloween. We took about 900 candy bars to the same area in Santee where the Christimas lights are. We loaded our jumbo size wagon with candy and gave each child the choice to choose 2 candy bars (one for each hand) and gave them or their parents a gospel tract and an invite to church. In 2 hours everything was gone. It was a very fun time and such an easy way to use Halloween to reach children and their parents with the gospel message.

I had an interesting talk with a student at SDSU this week. This young man said he'd seen the "Eternity" tract for months and wasn't really interested. However, recently he has found the subject of the gospel has really gotten his attention. As a matter of fact, not only had he read it several times but wanted to meet the person who wrote it, which of course is me. We had a very warm heart to heart talk for 20 minutes or so. He even stated that he intentionally missed his next class to talk about what it meant to be saved. His name is Gabriel. Please pray for him as I hope we can somehow connect again.

I had a heartbreaking encounter recently at SDSU. The conversation was only a few sentences long but very distressing. I handed the Eternity tract to a young lady and asked what she thought of the question, "Where will you spend eternity?" I could tell by her outward attitude that something was deeply troubling her. She responded, "I tried to kill myself yesterday. I wish I was dead." then she walked away. As she walked away, I said "I will pray for you." She gave me a quick thumbs up and was gone. I still look for her but haven't seen her yet.

He comes most every weekend with some Christian brothers who set up a canopy with gospel tracts. David has enough strength to lift his forearm offering a gospel tract (as you can see) for those who notice and are willing. Praise the Lord for great warriors like David.
