The masses did not take the literature but yet several hundred did. We did some open air preaching on the foundation of the faith concerning the character of God, Jesus and Salvation. Even short sentences received can be used by God.

There were other ministries there also. Some unfortunately were not very kind towards Mormons in their signs or speech. We stayed away from those that we didn't want to be identified with. In the many hours that we were there I can't think of any Mormon that was unkind towards us. I had a number of delightful talks with Missionaries and others that God directed our way. We are tired but grateful to our Lord.

6 of us went to Parkway Plaza shopping mall with an approved permit. Here again we sowed seeds of truth with many tracts and personal encounters. This environment again proved that our culture has very little knowledge or interest in the God that has given them life and in whom they are accountable. Indifference and apathy seems to rein everywhere.

God will have a people and uses all these means of proclaiming the gospel to build His church. PTL.
