

Pacific Beach, SDSU and Balboa Park

Often I have reported a never before experienced event and this month was no exception. Let me explain.

Brother Marc accompanied me to Balboa Park on a Saturday just a couple weeks ago. As we entered the park near the Rueben Science Center there were a number of religious booths setup. Several I had never seen before. One had a large blue canopy with the words, "The Church of Jesus Christ."

I know several Christian ministries that often go to Balboa Park with banners with the name "Jesus Christ" on them but this one had nothing hinting what they stood for.

My initial thought was perhaps the Mormons but they never would simplify their name in public without adding "of Latter-day Saints." As soon as I saw just two books on the table I suspected perhaps one of the offshoots of Mormonsim, which happened to be right. One book was the Bible and the other was the Book of Mormon. There was just one man in the booth with a young teen there as well, perhaps his son. He assured me they were not part of the Utah Mormons but none the less believed in Joseph Smith.

Many years ago I read a book describing over 100 splits and splinter groups who likewise believe in the Book of Mormon but reject polygamy and the many gods of Mormonism. When I challenged him on how he could believe Joseph Smith a prophet and yet reject what he taught. He had no problem agreeing that Smith was a fallen prophet but yet still should be followed.

I pointed out that the Bible describes only two types of prophets, true or false. If you teach a false god or doctrines that contradict the prophets you shouldn't be listen to. In the

Old Testament they would be stoned. He insisted the Book of Mormon didn't contradict the Bible and should be followed. I countered why do we need it if the Bible was sufficient? If it teaches something different then it falls under the condemnation of Galations 1:8,9 where Paul pronounces a curse on those who preach another gospel even if it were an angel of heaven (which is the very roots of this religion).

We had a spirited conversation for 20 minutes with multiple arguments proving this religion was false. I doubt that he had ever had a Christian that knew his religion better than he with a powerful defense of the true gospel.

My final 3 arguments focused there never was a "total apostacy." Jesus had kept His promise to build His church. Testing the Book of Mormon by praying for a feeling is unbiblical. And that the Book of Mormon's teaching that we are saved "after all we can do" is a false gospel. Tragically, once you have your mind made up facts don't matter.
