The earliest documentation in possession of the USFA, pertaining to our geographic boundaries, dates back to 1959. Back then, our Division did not include any territory south of the Tampa peninsula but did cover land as far north as St. Augustine.

In 1984, the three current Florida divisions were adjusted and better defined. The Central Florida Southern border was extended to Ft. Myers, while the northern limit was brought down to Palm Coast. In 1989, an actual map was submitted to the USFA. This map matches the description from 1984.
