# THE GREATEST IS LOVE

So many times, I have heard this scripture read at weddings or renewings of vows. Jennifer and I read them at our wedding. Not understanding the verse, I applied it to my love for my wife.

However, years later, as I was in seminary, I understood there was so much more to this verse. When we take the verse and study the word 'love,' it means 'agape' in Greek. It is a strong, positive emotion of regard and affection. In many instances, it is the love that God has for His people. In others, it is the love that we have for God Himself that we give back to Him. It is the highest type of love that one can show to someone.


Two other types of love are spoken of in the Bible: 'eros,' which is sensual love, and 'philia,' which is brotherly love (which is how the city of Philadelphia got its nickname).

As we reflect on agape love, let's consider the example of Jesus Christ, as described in 1 John 3:16-18. Christ's love for us was not merely spoken but demonstrated through the ultimate sacrifice on the cross. This sacrificial love goes beyond mere affection or emotional regard. It's an active, selfless giving for the well-being of others, mirroring the way Jesus loved humanity. By understanding and striving to emulate this level of love, we can deepen our relationships with God and each other, genuinely fulfilling the commandment to love as He loved us.

Remember what scripture says about love as we celebrate Valentine's Day on the 14th. Out of faith, hope, and love, love is the greatest. Why is that? We have faith in the Lord because of our love for Him. Faith is having strong confidence and reliance upon someone. We know that as believers, God will care for us because of His unfailing love. This, in return, makes us love Him unconditionally. Hope is the feeling and understanding that some desire will be fulfilled. We know that God will provide the desires that align with His Word. 
