Last month we gathered non-perishable food for a new ministry we are starting in the church to assist our community. The ministry is called the Luke 10 Ministry and the scripture deals with the Good Samaritan.

This ministry was inspired by the need in our community. Several months back there was an issue with a couple who had nowhere to go and no food. The only support we could offer was to buy them food. However, sometimes this is not the most beneficial in serving the best interest of the church and as good stewards. After much prayer, this ministry has started to come together to assist those in the community.

With food on hand, we can help immediately when someone needs assistance. It can be something such as a family that loses a home for some reason or a family that has fallen on hard times. There are many scenarios where this may best serve those in our community.





We will continue to collect food items as an ongoing ministry. If the food gets close to expiration, then we will donate it to a local food pantry.

In addition there was a discussion of what we are calling Luke 10 Bags. These are what some have seen called Blessing Bags. They will include essential items that someone may need for hygiene, toiletries, and other necessities. We will have these on hand at the church to give out if a need arises in the community.

The ultimate goal is to try and get one Blessing Bag in every car for the congregation. This way if you see someone in need, you can give them a bag to help with their need. I am by no means telling you to stop for just anyone. However, if you feel the Spirit leading you to help someone that may be in need, you can just hand them a bag out your car window.

We are missionaries here at home as much as we abroad and need to serve the community the best that we can in the sphere that the Lord has provided. I pray that this ministry will be able to accomplish this for us at First Baptist Church.

There will be more to come about this ministry.
