

Memories of Graewynn COVID/Illness Policy

1) We ask folks who have been knowingly exposed to COVID within 10 days of the game not to come to game. If Directors are exposed, they will not come either.

If two or more Directors are exposed/showing symptoms we may be forced to cancel the game on short notice. It is untenable to be able to run the game with half or less the director staff. We will attempt to set aside cabin space for folks who may come down with symptoms of COVID or any other sickness during the game.

If we are unable to allocate space, we may be forced to ask those people to leave the game. If that person carpooled with others, we may be forced to ask all in that carpool to leave as well. We encourage folks who are carpooling to be proactive and if someone they may be traveling with is ill, to not bring them. We will not issue refunds to folks we have to ask to leave the game.

2) Anyone who is feeling ill before a game should not come to the game. Even if it is not COVID, we do not want to spread illness among players. Between the proximity of people in play or sleeping spaces, illness can and will spread. If someone pre-regged and does not come due to illness, we will issue a refund if they do not come and request one.

3) Anyone showing any signs of illness during game are required to wear a mask indoors and social distance. Anyone who refuses, including Directors, staff, or Marshals, will be asked to leave the play space. If players choose to get closer to these people, that is their choice, and they accept the risk.

If we observe someone does not look well, we may ask them to have their temperature taken with an infrared thermometer. Anyone who shows a temperature of 100 degrees or more will be asked to mask and quarantine. We will provide time for the person to cool off if they were just in combat or running around to avoid potential false readings.

4) When it comes to meals or Feast time, anyone who has been asked to mask, may request food brought to them and does not have to wait in line. Someone will bring them their food and utensils to ensure we maintain social distancing.

Folks who are wearing masks are asked to sit away from others while eating/drinking to limit possible exposure while they have meals.
