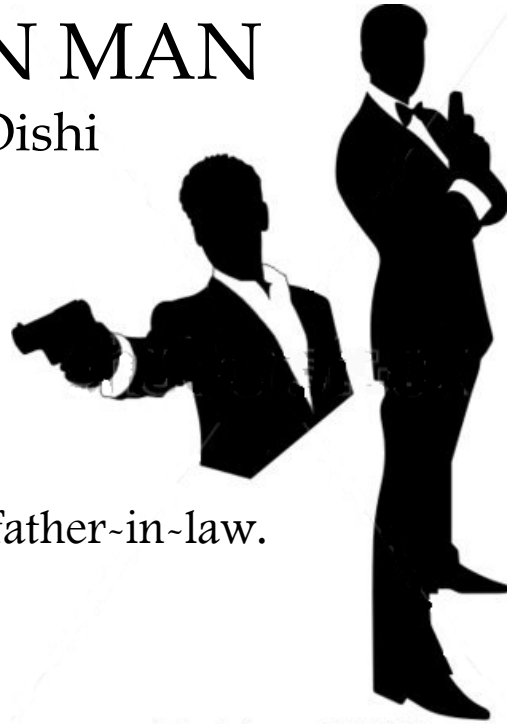


SECRET ASIAN MAN
